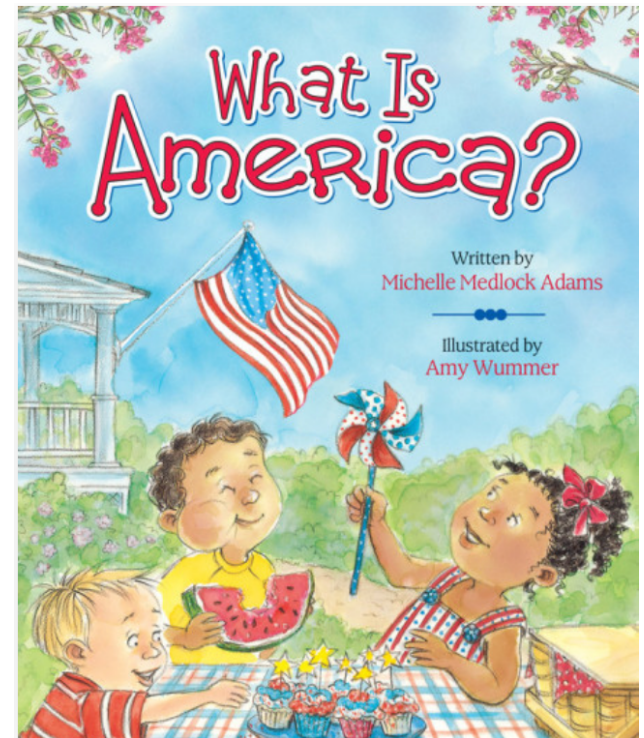


There are many ways to describe America! What words come to mind when you think of the United States? Color the words below. Can you think of any others? Write them in the empty spaces.

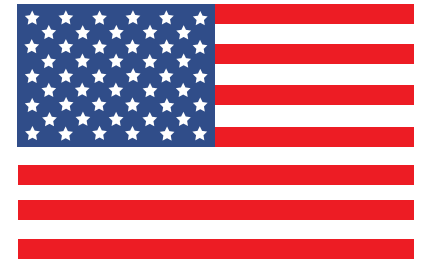
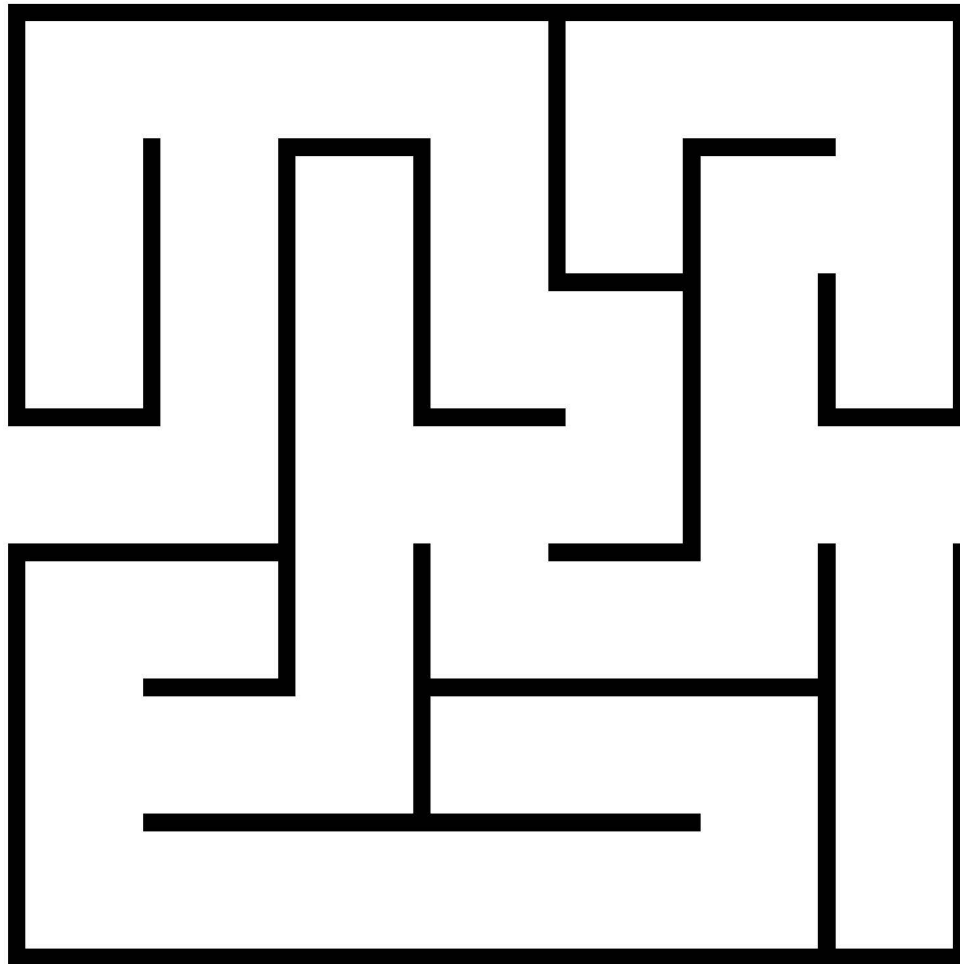
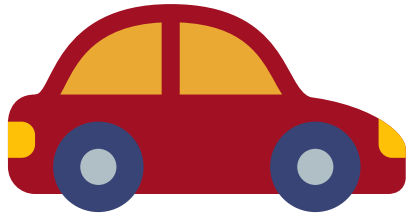

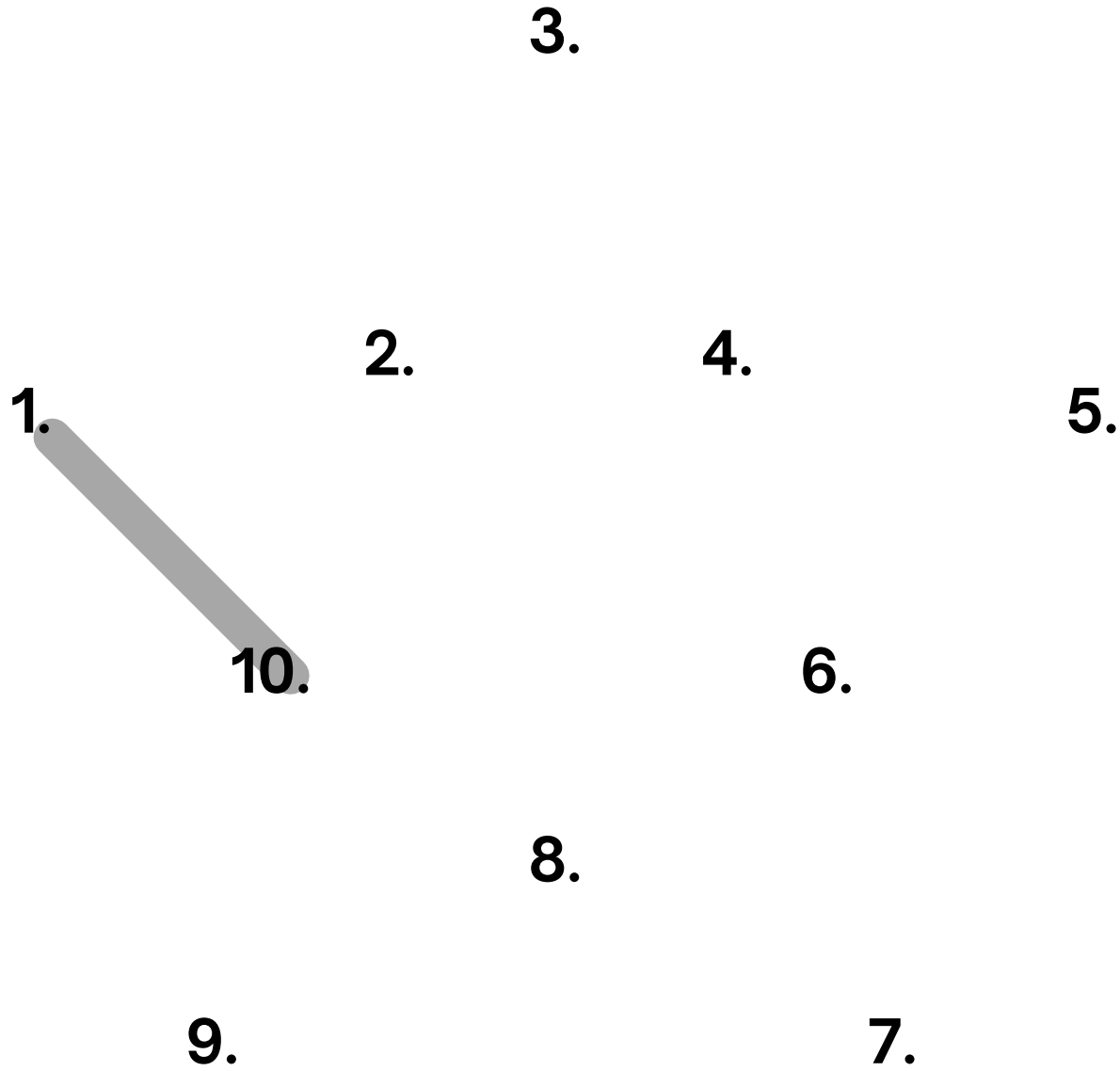




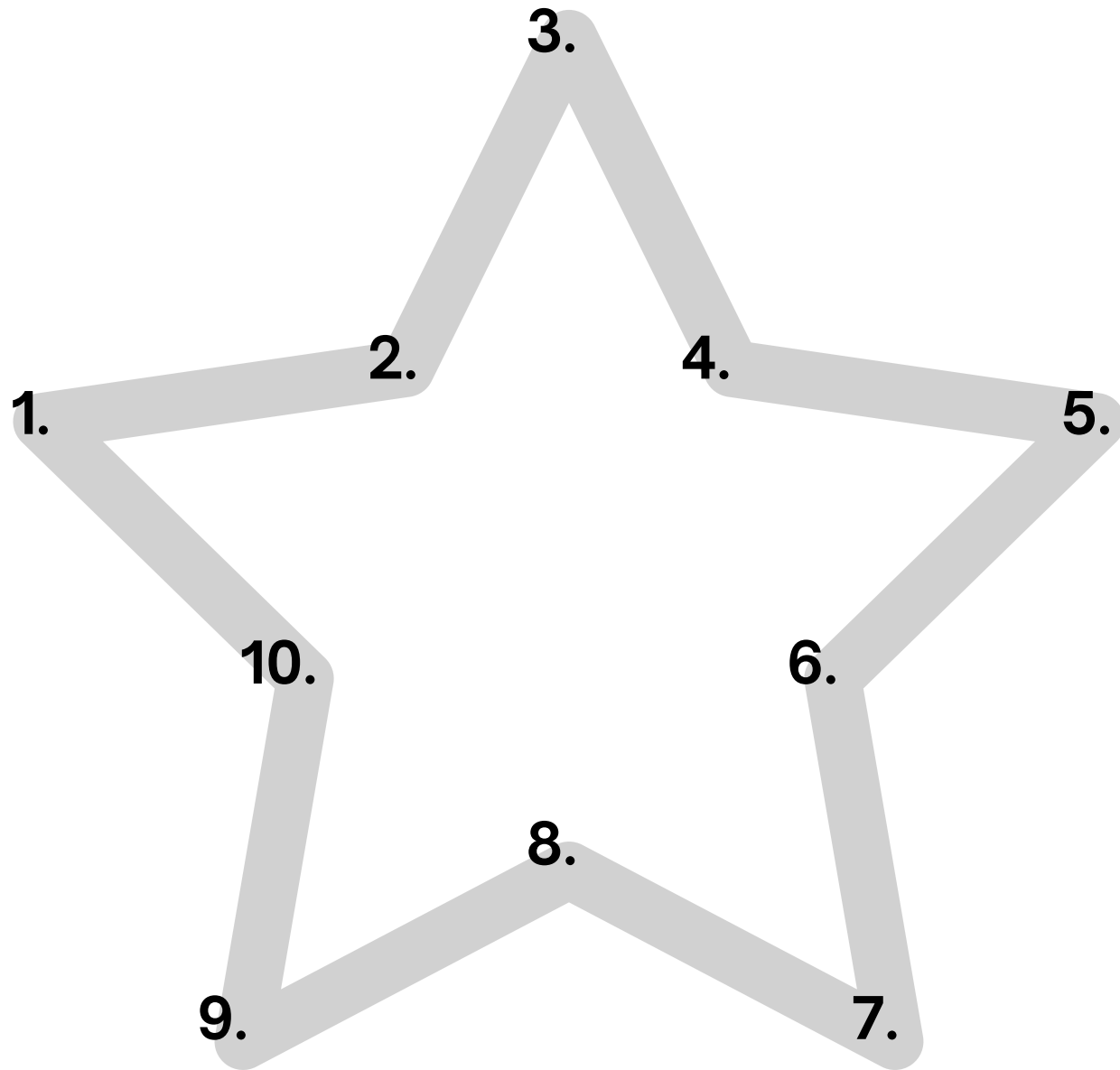
