stands out better against smoother varieties. A high-end printing process, it can take three weeks to a month. It lends itself well to graphics and is used by many custom designers. There's been a renaissance of this vintage technique among small printers.

#### Thermography

This modern process was designed to mimic the look of engraving at a more affordable price. The design is flat printed (see next entry) and dusted with resin powder while wet; it's then heated up, causing the letters to rise. Though paper snobs will miss engraving's telltale indentations and might detect a telltale sheen left behind by the resin, the average guest won't know the difference. Turnaround is two weeks to a month.

## Offset or flat printing

Offset printing provides the same effect you would get from a personal printer, but it's done at a commercial printing house with higher quality and quicker machines. As I mentioned, it's becoming more popular as invitations stray from tradition, but it wouldn't be a good choice for a very simple design on high-quality paper. Turnaround time is significantly lower for this least expensive of methods. One caveat: The heaviest paper won't fit through a printer.

#### The Font

Unless you're using unusual paper, the font affects the look of the invitation more than anything else. The typeface conveys a mood, an era, even the formality of the event. If you're doing an Art Deco wedding, head straight for Parisian or Kingsbury. If you're having a casual beach wedding, think about a sans serif style such as Engravers Gothic rather than a traditional font like Edwardian Script. Make readability a priority—flourishes lose their effect when guests have to struggle to read the print.

### **Ink Color**

THOUGH STATIONERS' RULE BOOKS long maintained that black or dark gray were the only acceptable
