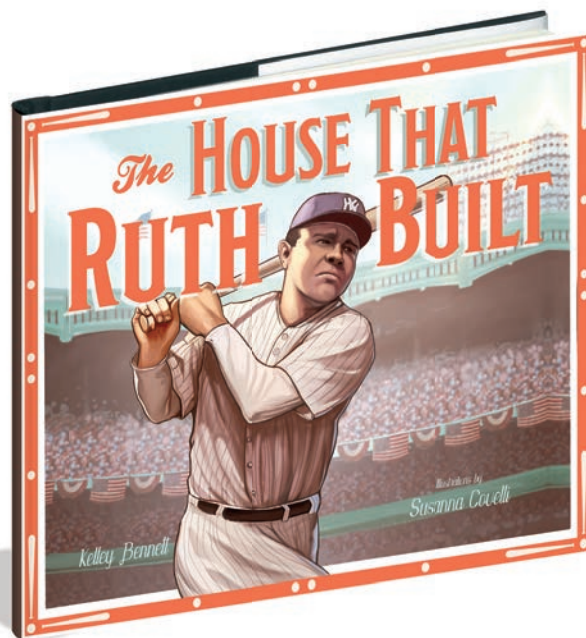

BASEBALL LEAGUES

Major League Baseball is divided into two leagues. The National League, which was formed in 1876, and the American League, which was formed in 1901. During regular season games, teams compete against other teams in the same league. The champion teams in each league compete in the best-of-seven games World Series.

WHO'S WHO?

Uniforms in the early days were plain and looked pretty much the same—white for home games, gray for away games. The only way to tell the players were one team from players on the other was to look at the color of their "socks." Other than the all-star game, teams wore their own colors. Each team's socks (except for the Yankees) were different colors. There were Green Stockings, White Stockings, Brown Stockings, and baseball's first professional team, known in 1883 as the Cincinnati "Red Stockings." Other teams were called the Blues, Grays, and Maroons.

THE NAME GAME

Another way baseball clubs were identified was by the teams' home city and the league. For example, Boston was called the "Boston Americans" because they were based in Boston and were in the American League (and wore blue socks). Seven years later, in 1908, the team changed its socks and its name officially becoming the "Boston Red Sox."

In the same way, the Yankees were first called the "New York Americans." Then, when the club's home field was Hilltop Park, they became the "Hilltoppers" or "Hillgoopers." A sportswriter first called the club "Yankees," or "Yanks" for short, in 1904, and the name stuck.

Hail the Red Sox to challenge the Yanks.
Hail the Yankees to take on the Sox.

BADE RUTH, THE GAME CHANGER

Before Babe Ruth came on the scene in 1914, baseball was mostly about pitching, running, and hitting—but not home runs. No player before the Babe had ever slugged a baseball as far as he had. Fans flocked to games with hopes of seeing The Great Bambino in action. He turned baseball into the most dramatic sport in its history.

After the 1919 season, the Yankees bought Babe Ruth from the Boston Red Sox for \$125,000, the highest price paid for a baseball player in those days. Doctors called the season a tragedy but were they? In 1920 his first season with the Yankees, Babe hit a record-setting 54 home runs, nearly twice as many as in all of his previous seasons. The next season, during the July 18, 1921 game against the Cleveland Tigers, Babe blasted a 540-foot homer. His longest recorded hit was in 1920, when he hit a 550-foot homer to break the existing major league career home run record set by Roger Connor in 1897. And even though Ruth was completely left-handed, he was still right-handed.

YANKEES VS RED SOX

The Yankees vs Red Sox rivalry wasn't just about the Babe. It was about the Yankees who had won the original four opening day games versus Boston Red Sox, including three future Hall of Famers: Babe Ruth, Mike Hays, and Herb Pennock. In total, there were five future Yankees Hall of Famers at the game that day, including manager Miller Huggins and owner Jacob Ruppert. There were no future Hall of Famers on the Red Sox team.

CURSE OF THE BAMBINO

Before Babe Ruth was sold to the New York Yankees, the Boston Red Sox were the worst-performing team in baseball. They'd won four World Series titles, more than any other team at the time. For three of those, Babe Ruth was on the team. For the 1918 season, the Sox were first in the league, but in one of the worst seasons, they finished with the last record in the league. Fans blamed the bad luck on Red Sox owner Harry Frazar selling players, especially Babe Ruth, to the Yankees. The Red Sox would go 86 years before they truly won another World Series to break the curse.

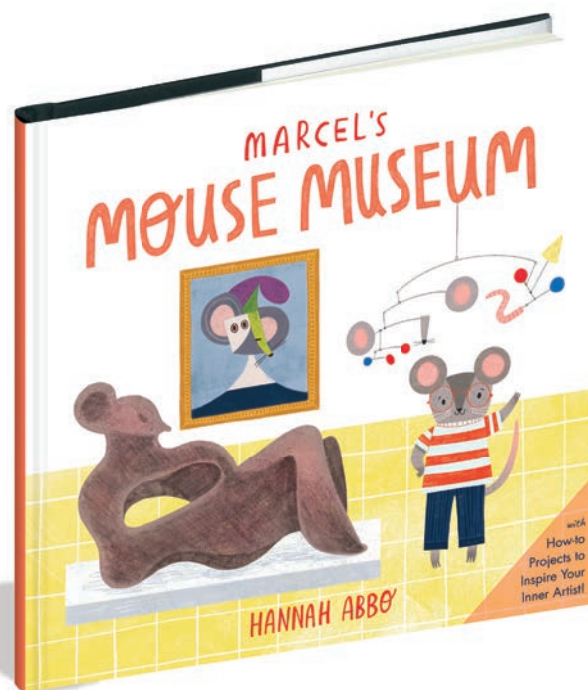

Probably the most famous artist in our collection, Parmesan Picasso is best known as the father of Cubism. What most mice don't know is that he was first inspired by a beautiful block of cheddar cheese. He also combined his love of cheese and painting in his earlier "Blue Cheese" period, where he painted everything in different shades of blue.

Picasso was born in Spain but soon moved to the mouse holes of Paris. He experimented with painting, sculpture, and ceramics, but also enjoyed sneaking into restaurants and feasting on gorgonzola.



HOW TO: MAKE A CONTINUOUS LINE DRAWING LIKE PICASSO!



You'll need: plain paper, a pen/pencil

1. Choose a subject. You could draw an animal, person, or something you can see.
2. Put your pencil on the paper and try to draw without taking it off the page. Try working quickly without too much planning!



Andy Mousehole was an American artist and film director known best for his involvement in Pop Art. He moved to New York City in 1949, and although it was dominated by rats at the time, he quickly began to make his mark. Mousehole learned the silk-screen print process, which meant he could reproduce the same image again and again, using different colored inks. He chose to print immediately recognizable pictures, such as a portrait of the famous actress Marilyn Mousemoe and the Cheesebell's soup tin.

HOW TO: MAKE A PRINT LIKE MOUSEHOLE!

You'll need: a large potato, a kitchen knife, a pen, paper, poster paint, an adult to help

1. Cut the potato in half and draw your design onto the flat surface. You could copy one of Andy Mousehole's images or choose something of your own!
2. Have an adult help you cut around the design with the knife. The part you want to print with should be left raised.
3. Pour some paint onto a plate and dip the potato in it, making sure the flat side is coated.
4. Stamp onto paper. You can do more than one stamp to show the mouse hole. Like Mousehole did!



Jean-Michel Basquiat was an American artist with Haitian and Puerto Rican heritage. He grew up in Brooklyn, New York, and as a teenager would spray-paint graffiti onto buildings. Although it was often too small for the people of New York City to notice, he became notorious in the rat community. In the early 1980s, Basquiat made the switch from graffiti artist to gallery artist. He often painted on discarded objects, such as wood from doors or windows, bits of foam, or rubber.

HOW TO: CREATE A BASQUIRAT-INSPIRED PORTRAIT

You'll need: something to paint on (could be paper, card, or some "found" surfaces such as old packaging), paint, pens/pencils, a white gel pen

1. Start by scribbling on the surface with your pens or pencils to create an energetic, messy background.
2. Paint your figure or portrait using a bold black color.
3. Add details such as facial features and writing using a white gel pen, or paint/other pens if you don't have one. Don't be afraid to go wild!

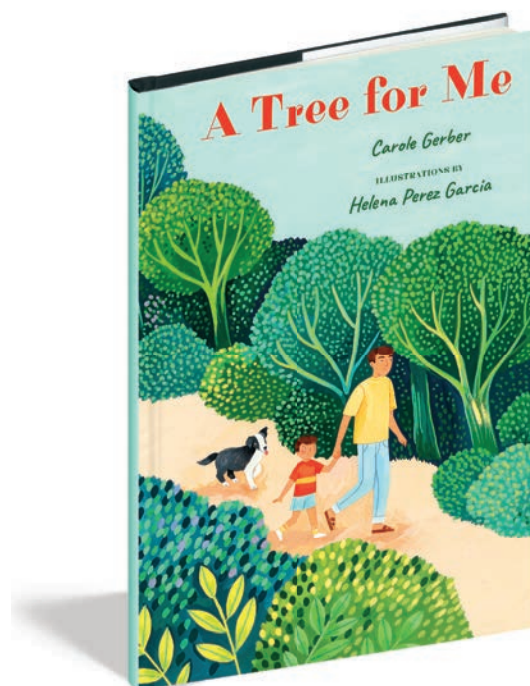

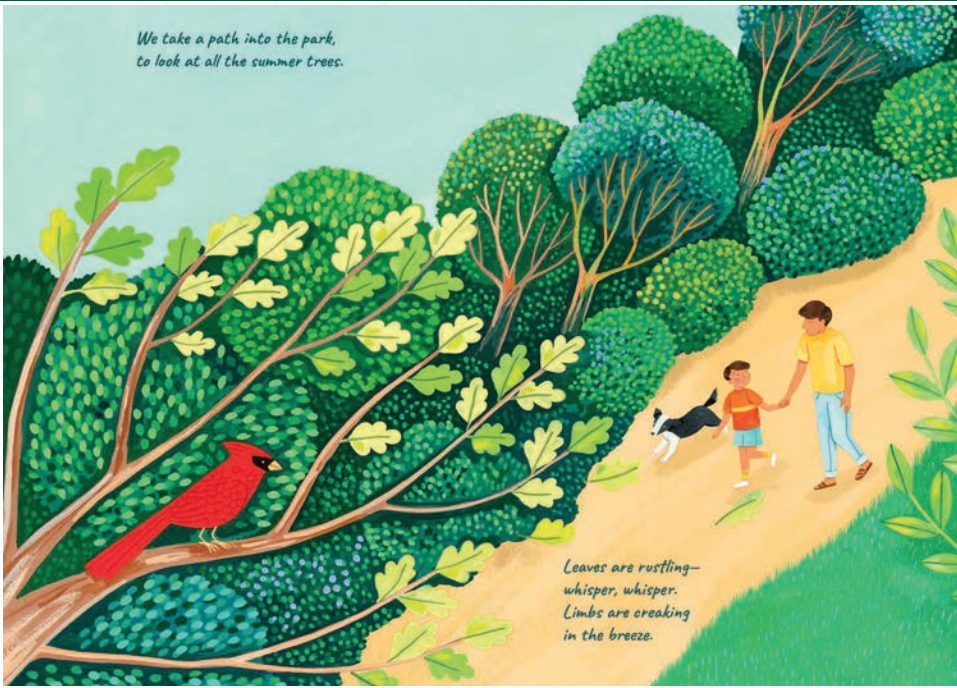

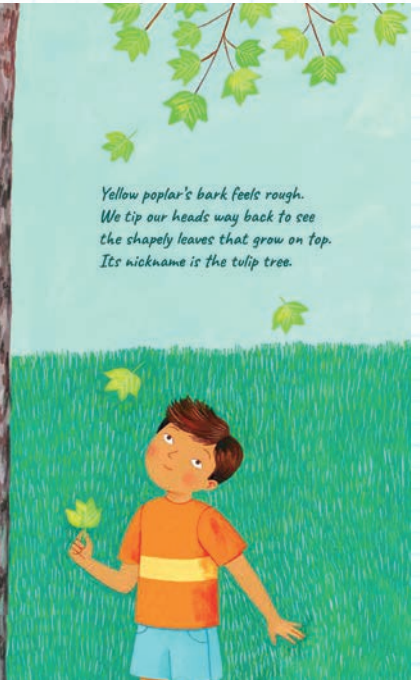

QUICK FACTS

- The polar bear is a **VULNERABLE** mammal found in the oceans and on the ice in the Arctic.
- Their fur is not white! Polar bear fur is hollow and see-through. When light hits it, it looks white. The skin underneath is actually black.



POLAR BEAR

Polar bears are the largest land-based predator on Earth, weighing up to 1,700 pounds. Their main food is seal. They wait patiently at the holes in the ice where the seals come up for air, then dart forward. Their long necks and claws (which can be two inches long) help them catch their prey in those small holes.

Their bodies help them in the water too. Large front paws work as paddles, and a thick layer of fat keeps them warm and helps them float. Their long necks help keep their heads above the water.

Mothers give birth to one or two cubs, occasionally even three. They are raised in a den for three or four months before venturing out into the cold. The cubs will stay with their mother for two to three years before they go off on their own.



ANIMAL VOICE

These quiet hunters are not very vocal, but they do roar, rumble, and chuff. They may give warnings to others or call to attract a mate. Cubs hum to their mothers.



WHAT ARE WE DOING?

Polar bears use the ice for hunting and to create dens to help raise their young. Loss of sea ice due to rising global temperatures means that polar bears must swim much farther in order to find food or mates. Humans must reduce greenhouse gas emissions to stop global warming and protect the polar bears' habitat.

QUICK FACTS

- The Sumatran orangutan is a **CRITICALLY ENDANGERED** primate found in the forests of the Indonesian island of Sumatra.
- Several types of trees rely on the Sumatran orangutan to distribute their seeds. Without the orangutans, those trees could disappear.



SUMATRAN ORANGUTAN

The name orangutan means person of the forest, which is fitting because these primates are one of the closest genetic relatives to humans. Like humans, they are smart. For instance, they teach and learn from each other. They also use tools: sticks are used for getting bugs out of holes, and leaves are used as gloves for handling prickly fruit.

Spending most of their lives in the trees, orangutans search for fruit, which makes up most of their diet. Their feet are similar to hands, allowing them to use both hands and feet to climb, eat, and use tools. Their arms are one-and-a-half times longer than their legs and help them climb and swing with ease. Each evening, they build a new nest of branches and leaves in the trees to sleep safely for the night. Some even make pillows to sleep on!

Female Sumatran orangutans only have babies every eight to ten years. Each baby is carried on its mother's back for about two years, and continues to nurse for another three or four years after that. Once they are grown, the young go off on their own.

Orangutans can live thirty-five to forty-five years in the wild and up to fifty years under human care.



ANIMAL VOICE

Sumatran orangutans make many different sounds, including kisses, squeaks, long calls, barks, and hoots. The males have large throat sacs that amplify their long calls. They use these long calls to attract females and claim their territory.



WHAT ARE WE DOING?

Conservationists are rescuing orangutans that have been illegally kept as pets, as well as orangutan orphans, and teaching them how to survive in the wild. They must teach them everything, including how to climb trees, find food, and build nests.

Palm oil plantations and other human developments have destroyed the orangutans' habitat. Conservation groups and multiple governments are working together to protect natural areas. Conservation groups are also teaching people at palm oil plantations how to reduce human-orangutan conflict.

- The kakapo is a **CRITICALLY ENDANGERED** bird found in the forests of New Zealand.
- The kakapo is the only flightless parrot in the world.



KAKAPO

The kakapo is a strange bird known as the world's only flightless parrot. It is a member of the parrot family, but it cannot fly. The kakapo is a nocturnal bird, meaning it is active at night. It is also a ground-dwelling bird, meaning it lives on the ground. The kakapo is a very rare bird, with only about 250 left in the world. It is found in the forests of New Zealand.



ANIMAL VOICE

The kakapo has a very different voice from other parrots. It makes a series of low, rumbling sounds that are often described as a series of 'p' sounds. These sounds are used for communication between kakapos.

WHAT ARE WE DOING?

COTTON-TOP TAMARIN

The cotton-top tamarin is a very social animal, living in groups called troops. It is also a very vocal animal, making a variety of sounds to communicate with its group.
