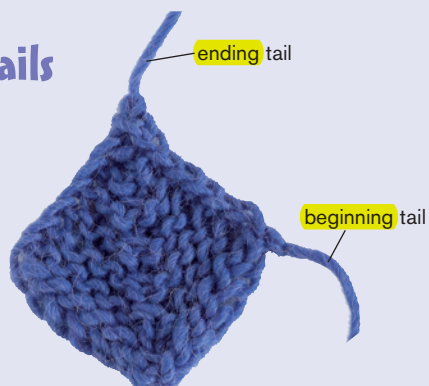


Row 4	Slip 1, knit 4, slip 1, K2tog, pssso, knit 4, purl 1. You now have 11 stitches.
Row 6	Slip 1, knit 3, slip 1, K2tog, pssso, knit 3, purl 1. You now have 9 stitches.
Row 8	Slip 1, knit 2, slip 1, K2tog, pssso, knit 2, purl 1. You now have 7 stitches.
Row 10	Slip 1 knit 1, slip 1, K2tog, pssso, knit 1, purl 1. You now have 5 stitches.
Row 12	Slip 2, K2tog, pssso, purl 1. You now have 3 stitches.
Row 14	Slip 1, K2tog, pssso.
	Cut yarn, leaving a 3" tail, and draw the tail through the final stitch.
	Using cc A, knit two more squares exactly like the first. You have now completed Squares #1, 2, and 3 (see layout, page 90).
JOINING THE BOTTOM SQUARES	
SET UP	Place two of the squares side by side with corners touching and with the decrease line running vertically from the bottom corner to the top.

Heads & Tails

If you keep this orientation in mind, you'll find it's easier to stay on track while making this scarf: The tail for the cast-on is always at the right when you're working on the right side of the scarf. The tail remaining from the last stitch is always at the top. The line that marks the decreases and runs from bottom to top corners should be vertical throughout the scarf.
