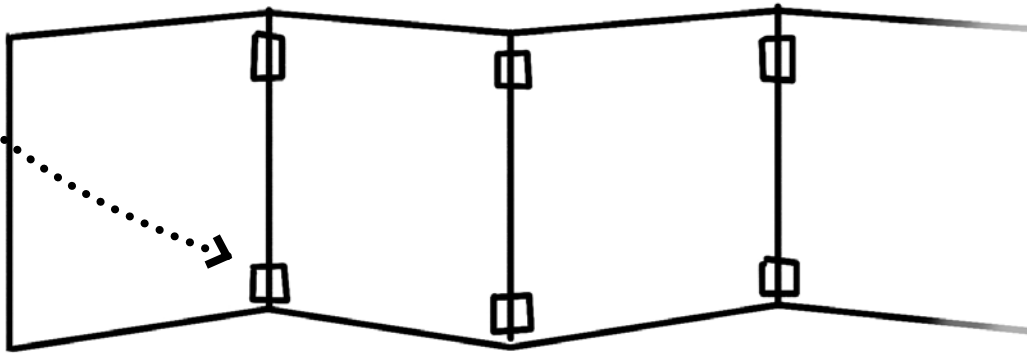


BrindleFox and his Regular Walks

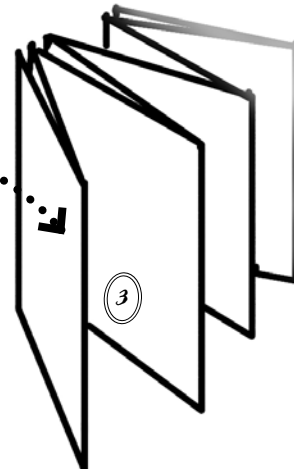
Coloring Mural or Coloring Book

- **Print out** these pages at 100% on letter-size paper (8.5" x 11")

- **Tape** pages together edge-to-edge to make one long scene.
- 21 pages connected will make a mural that is almost 15 feet long!

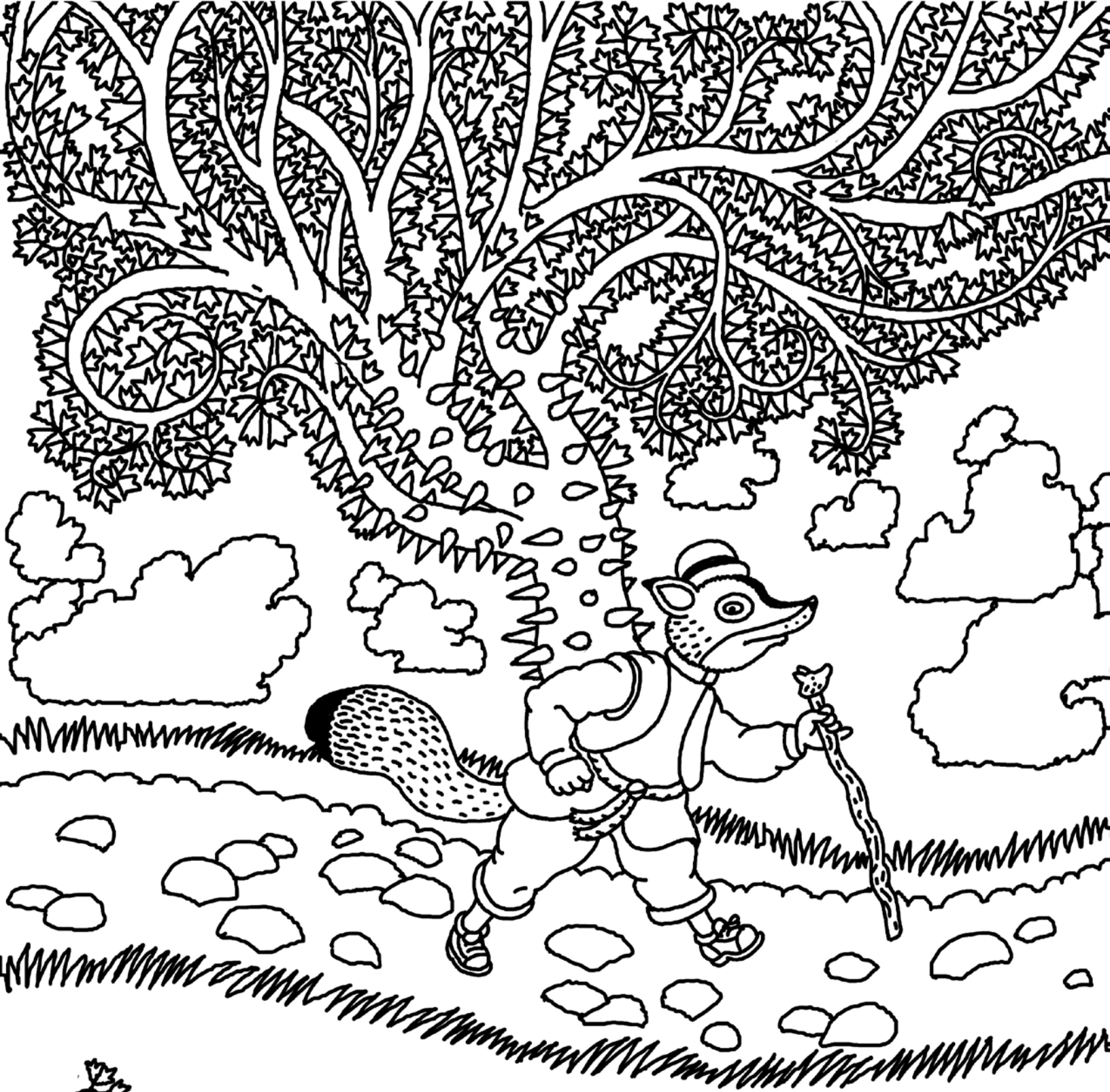


- **OR**, after you tape these together, you can fold these pages together, starting with the cover on front. When you open the cover, page 2 should be on the left side, and page 3 should be on the right.



- **COLORING** is very important. Be sure to color within the lines. *And* outside of the lines. And under the lines, and on top of the lines. Color this any way you like: remember, you are the **BOSS** and **COMMANDER** of **COLORS**!

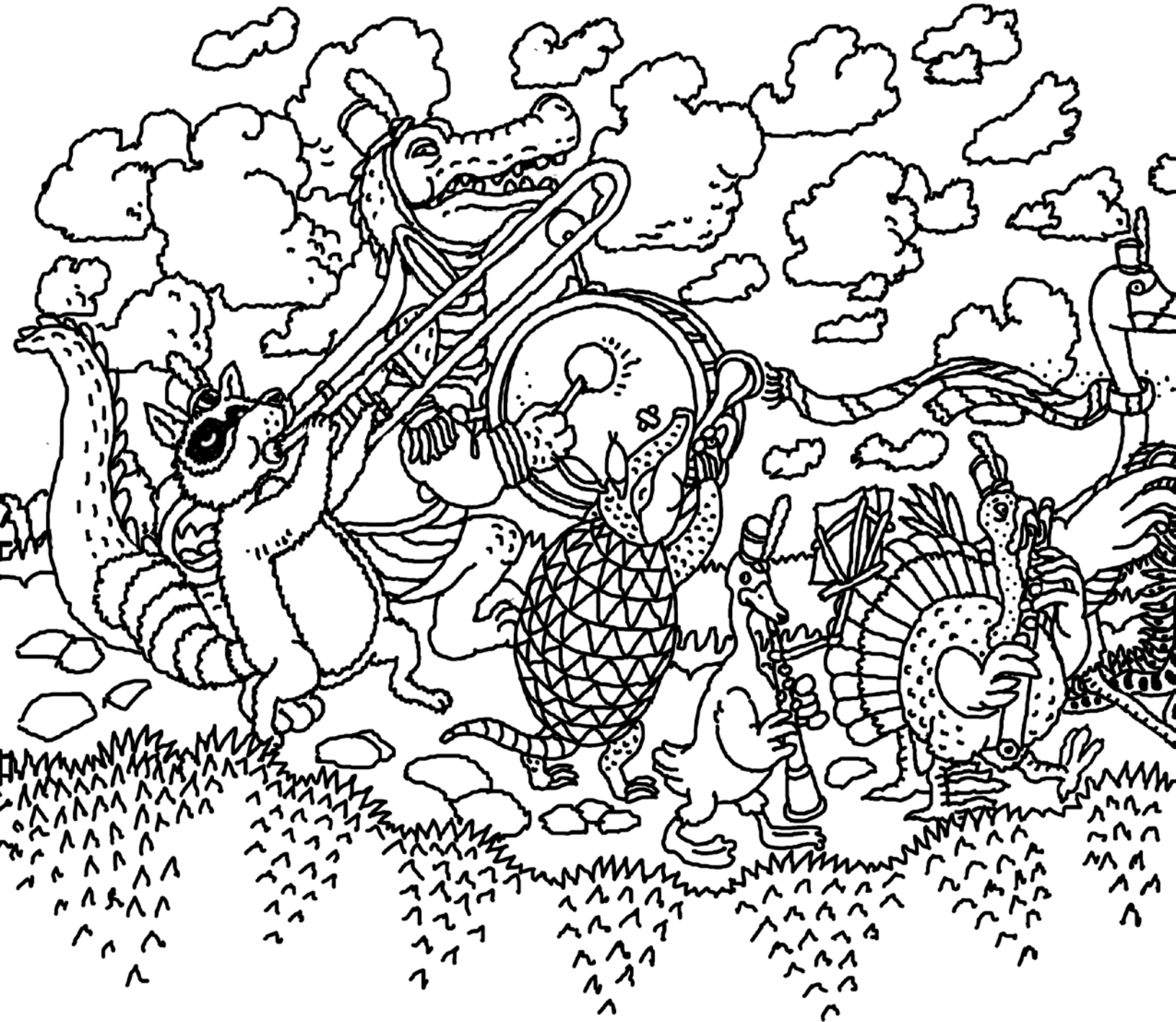

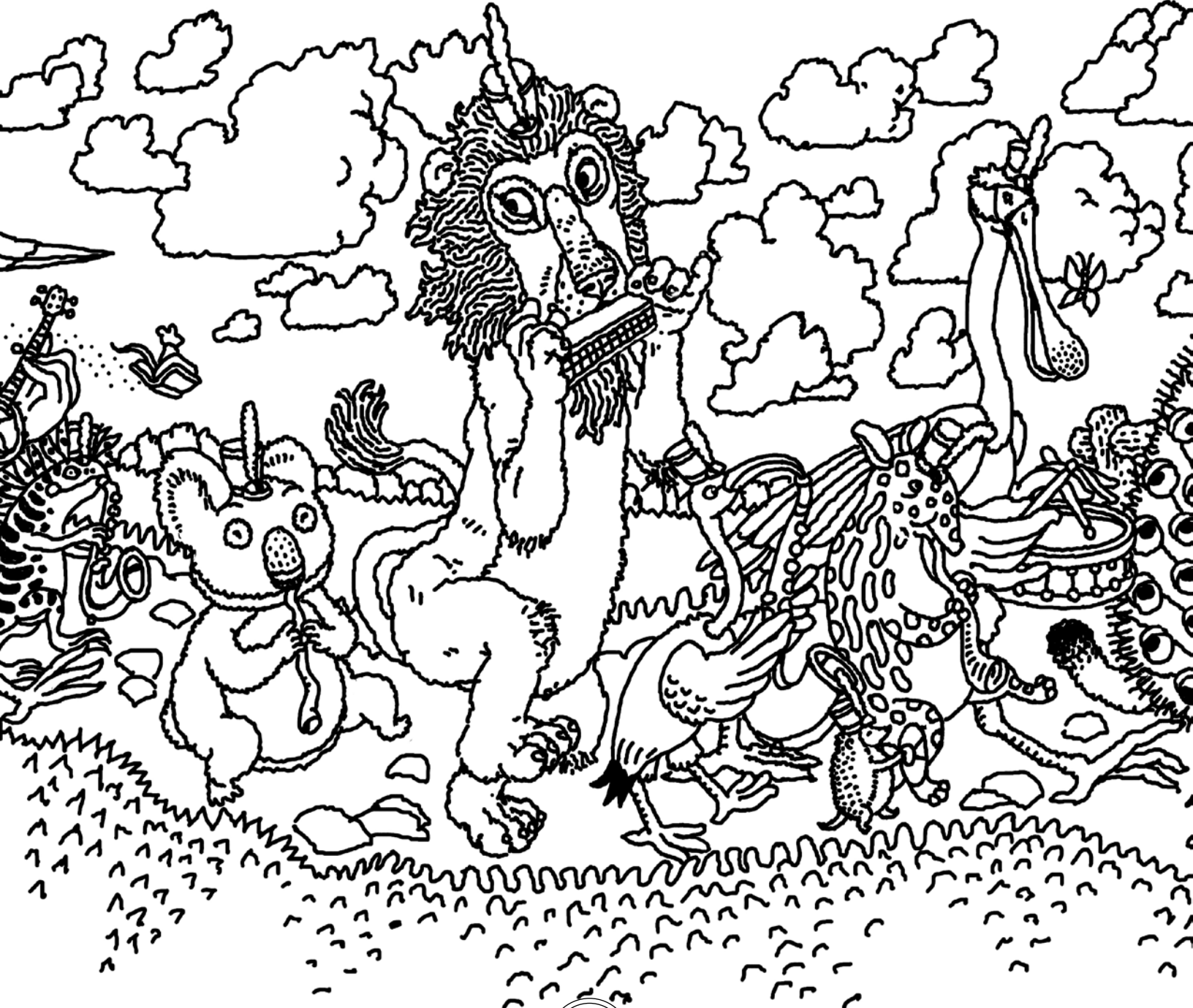


I once heard about someone

his shoes and his socks.

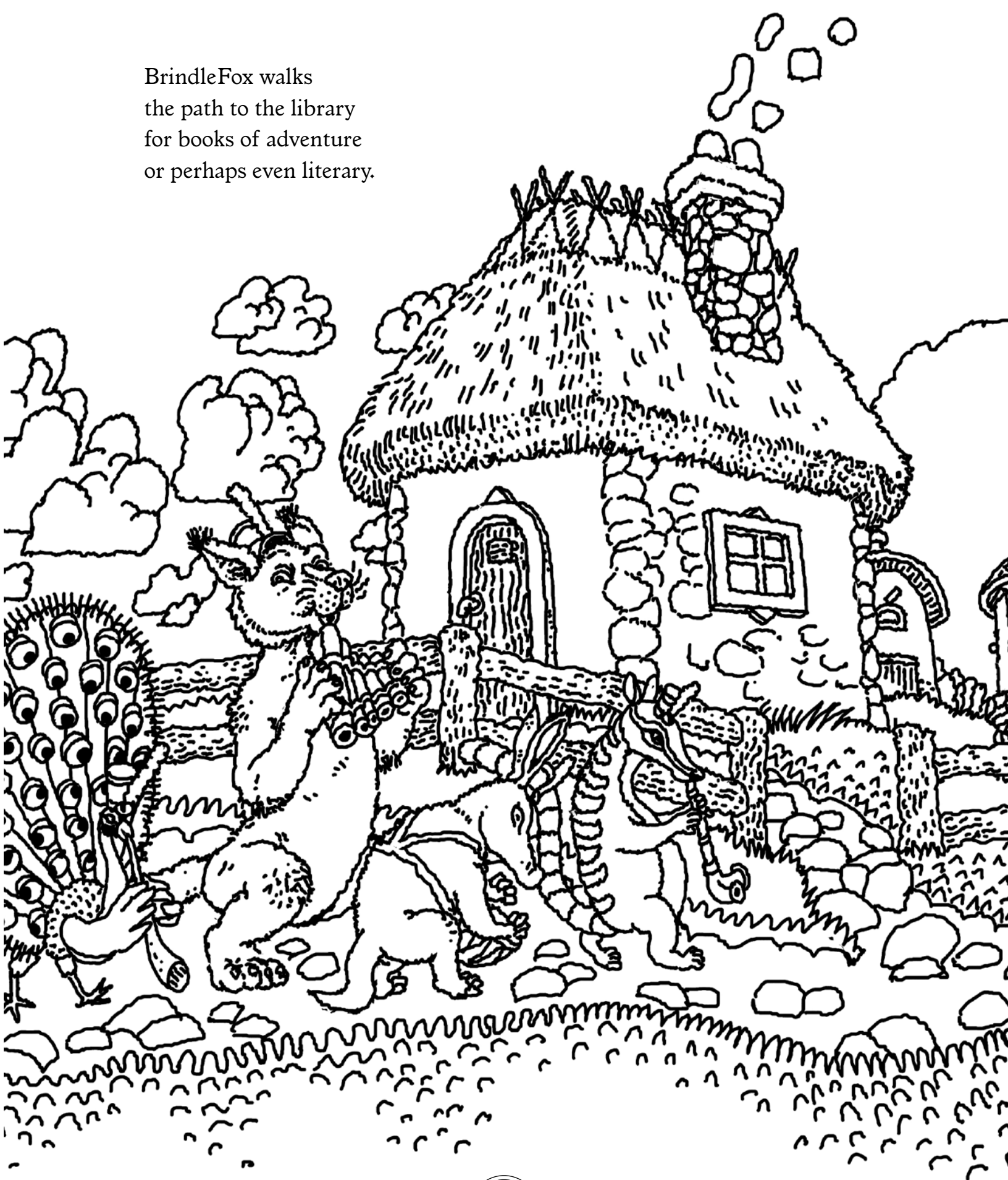
W-WAIT-what?—



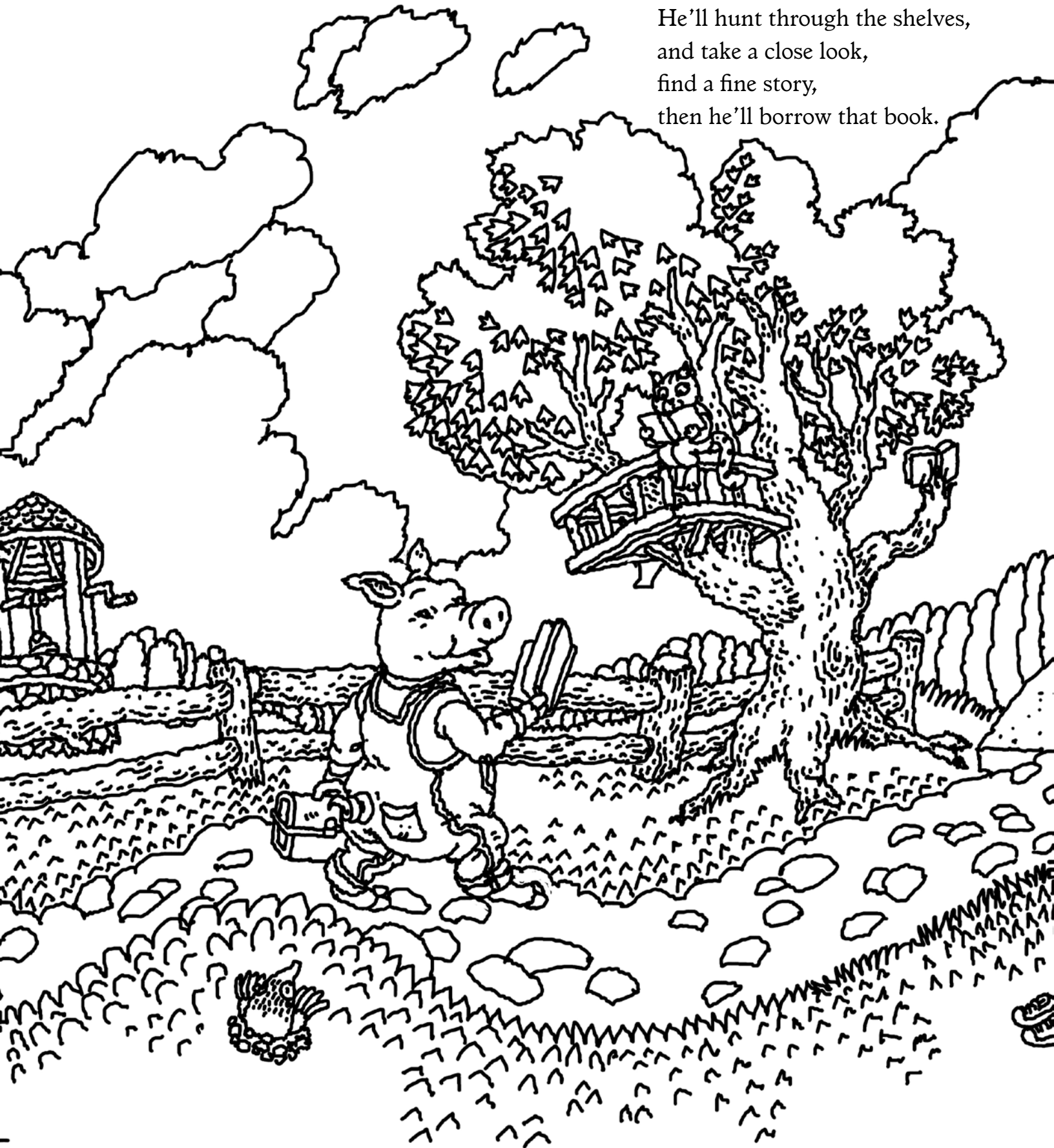
*He puts on his shoes -

That could only be . . . BrindleFox!*



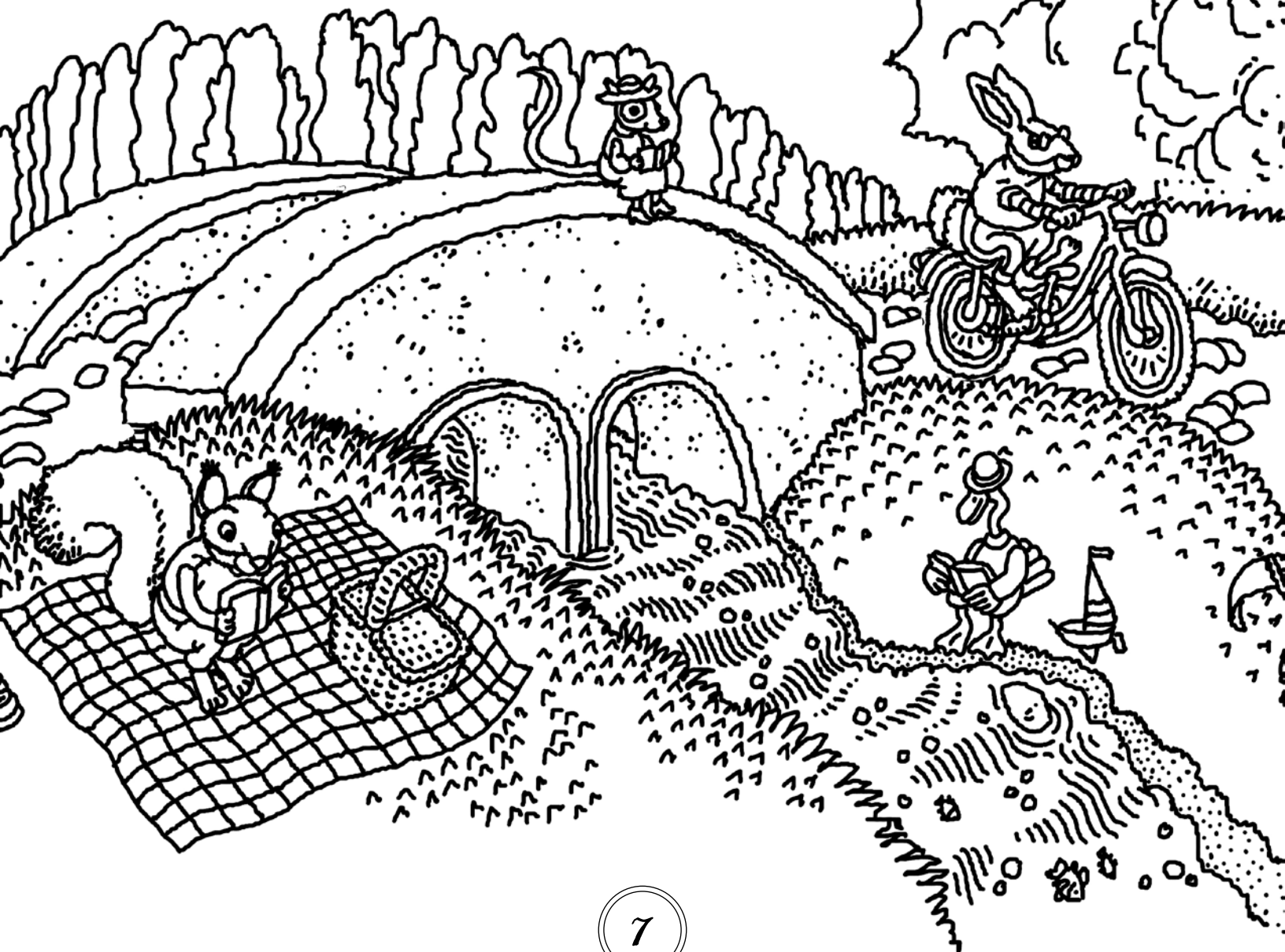
BrindleFox walks

or perhaps even literary.



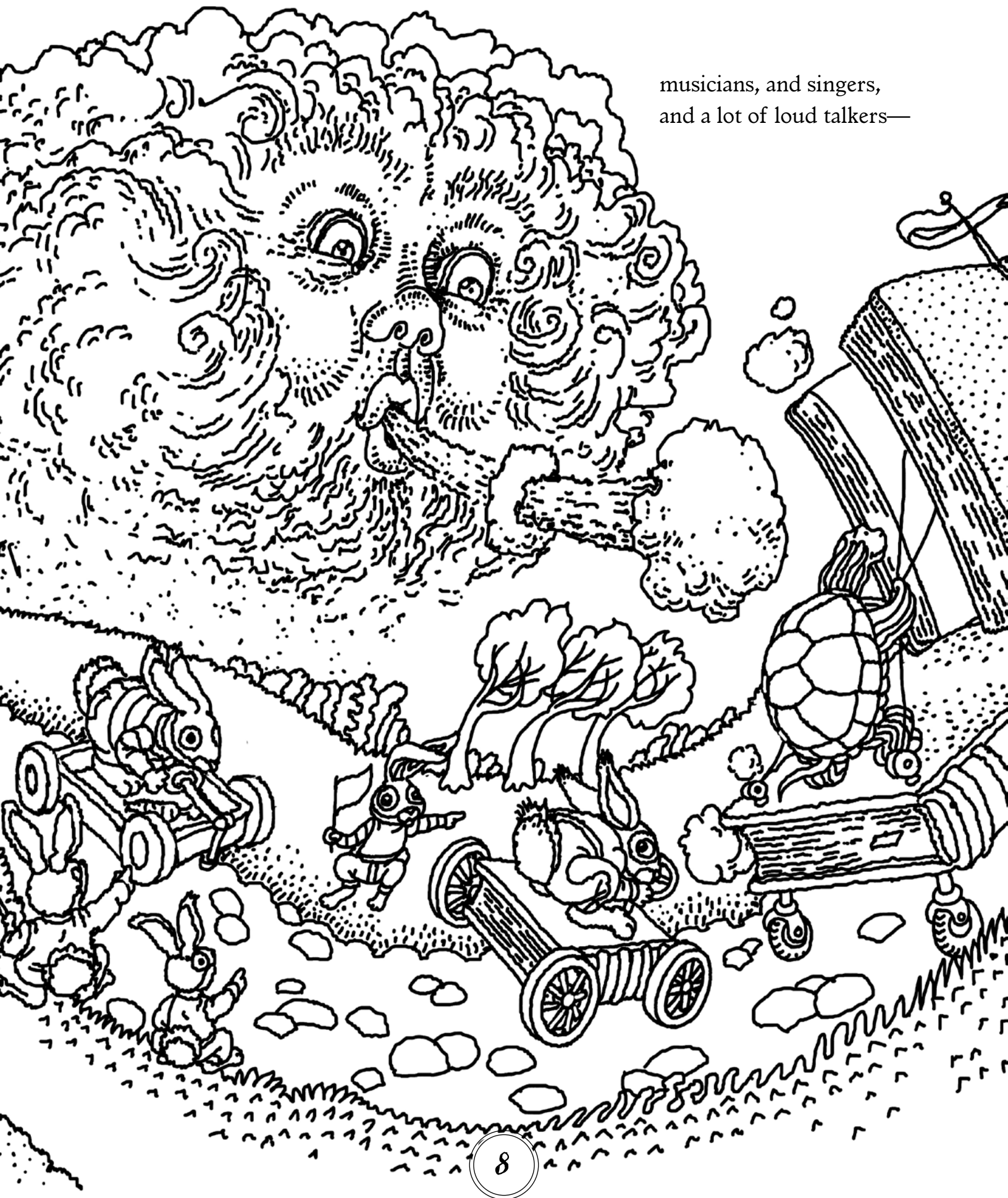
He'll hunt through the shelves,

then he'll borrow that book.



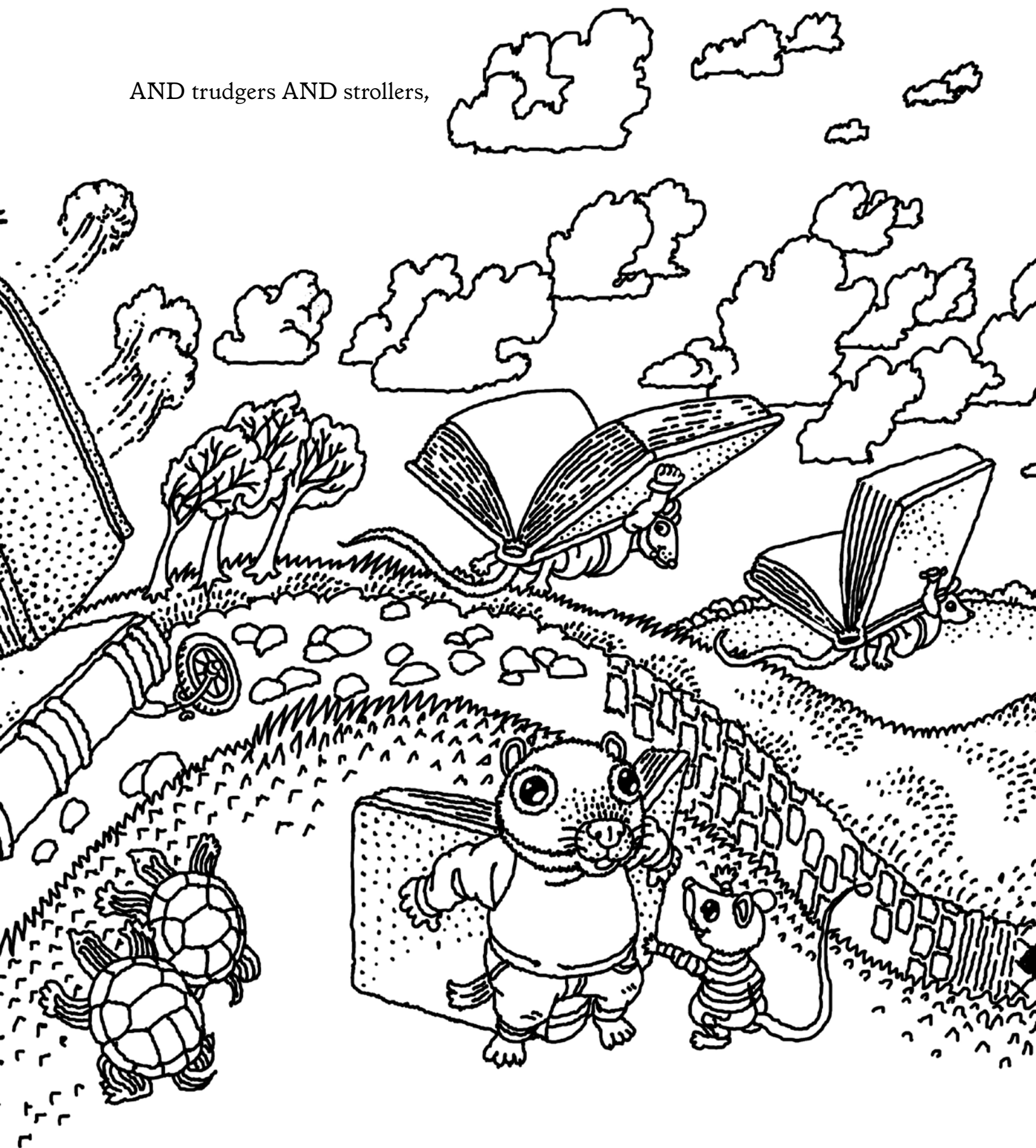
But the path is quite crowded
with so many walkers,



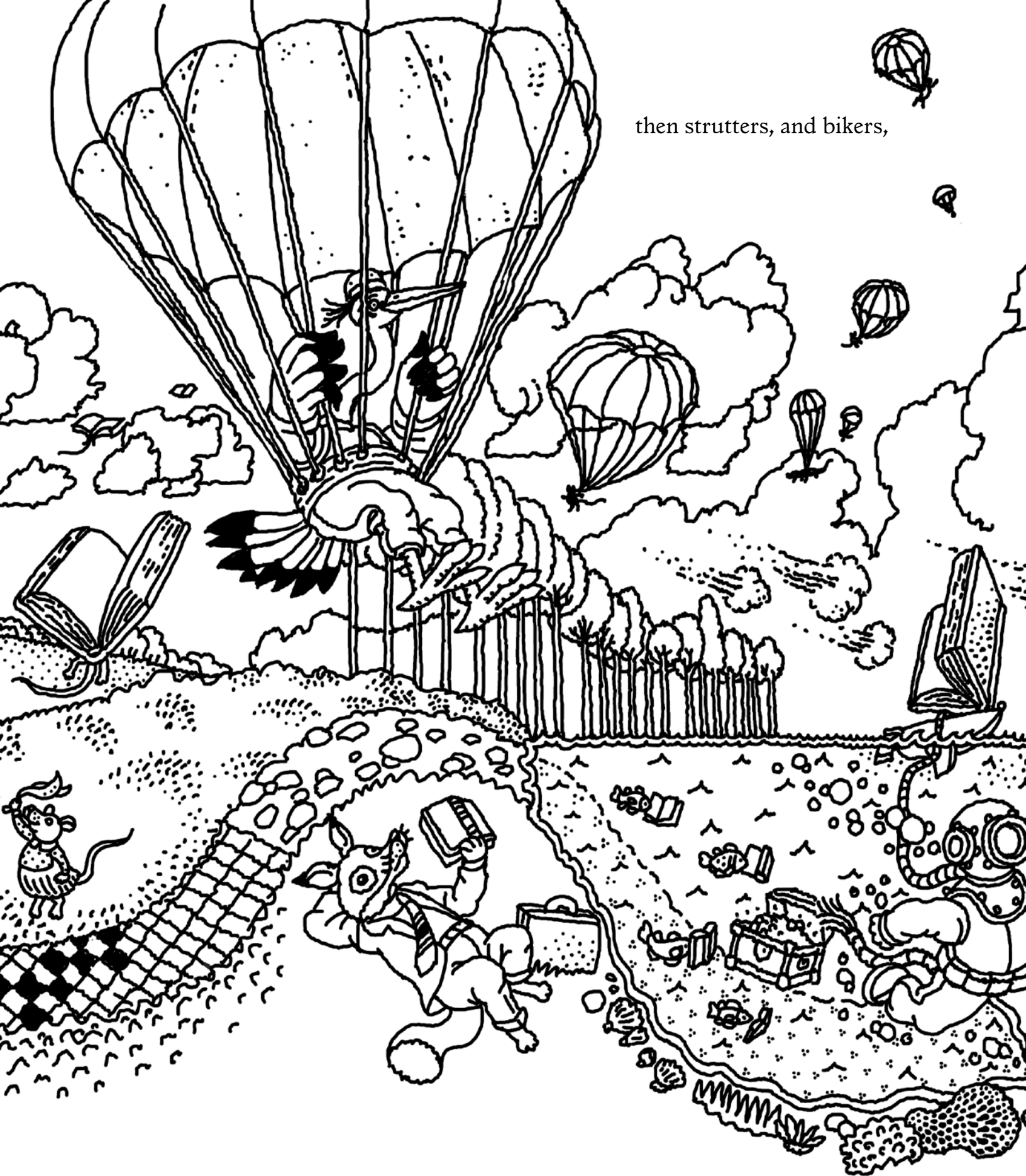
musicians, and singers,

AND trudgers AND strollers,

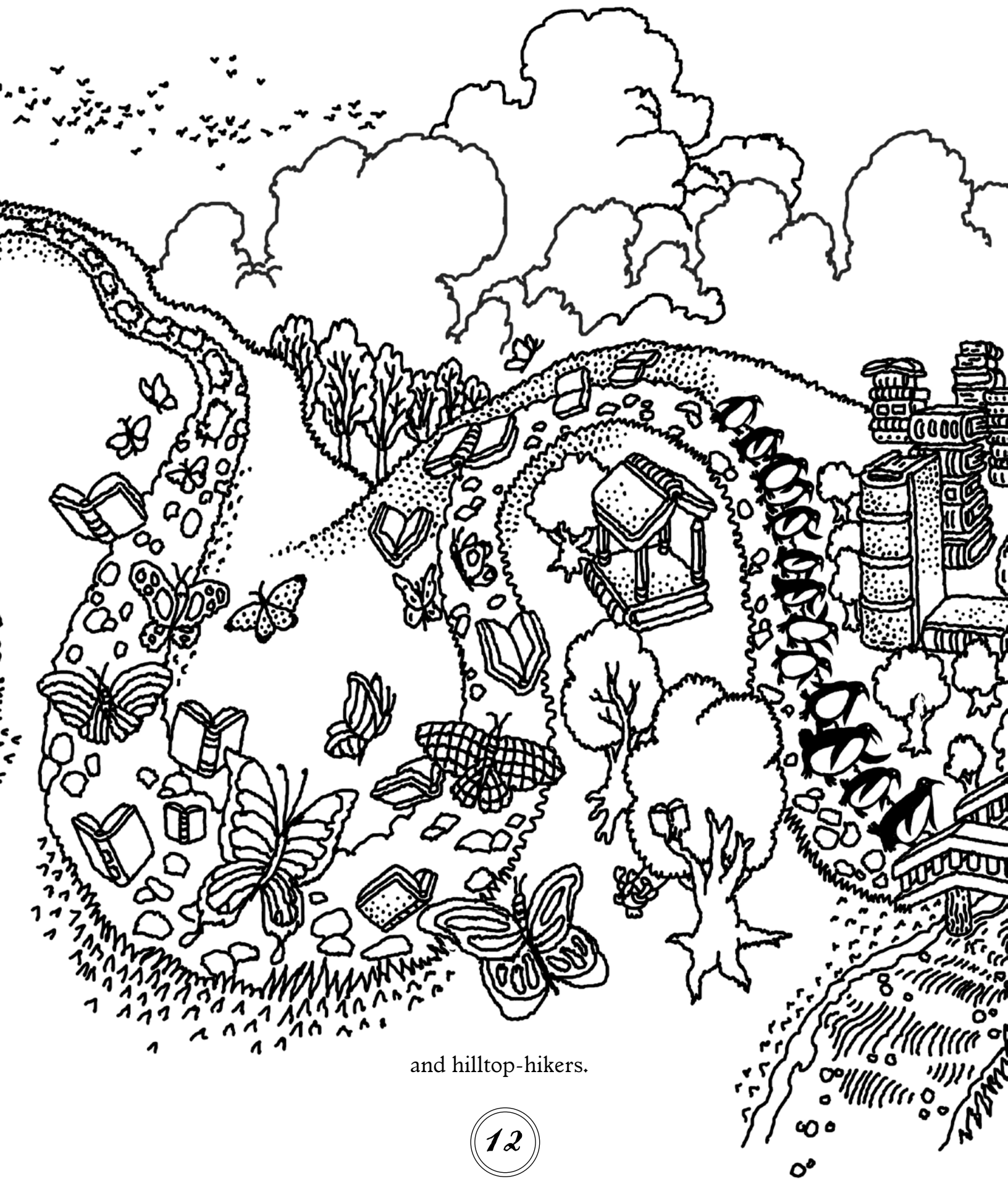


then strutters, and bikers,



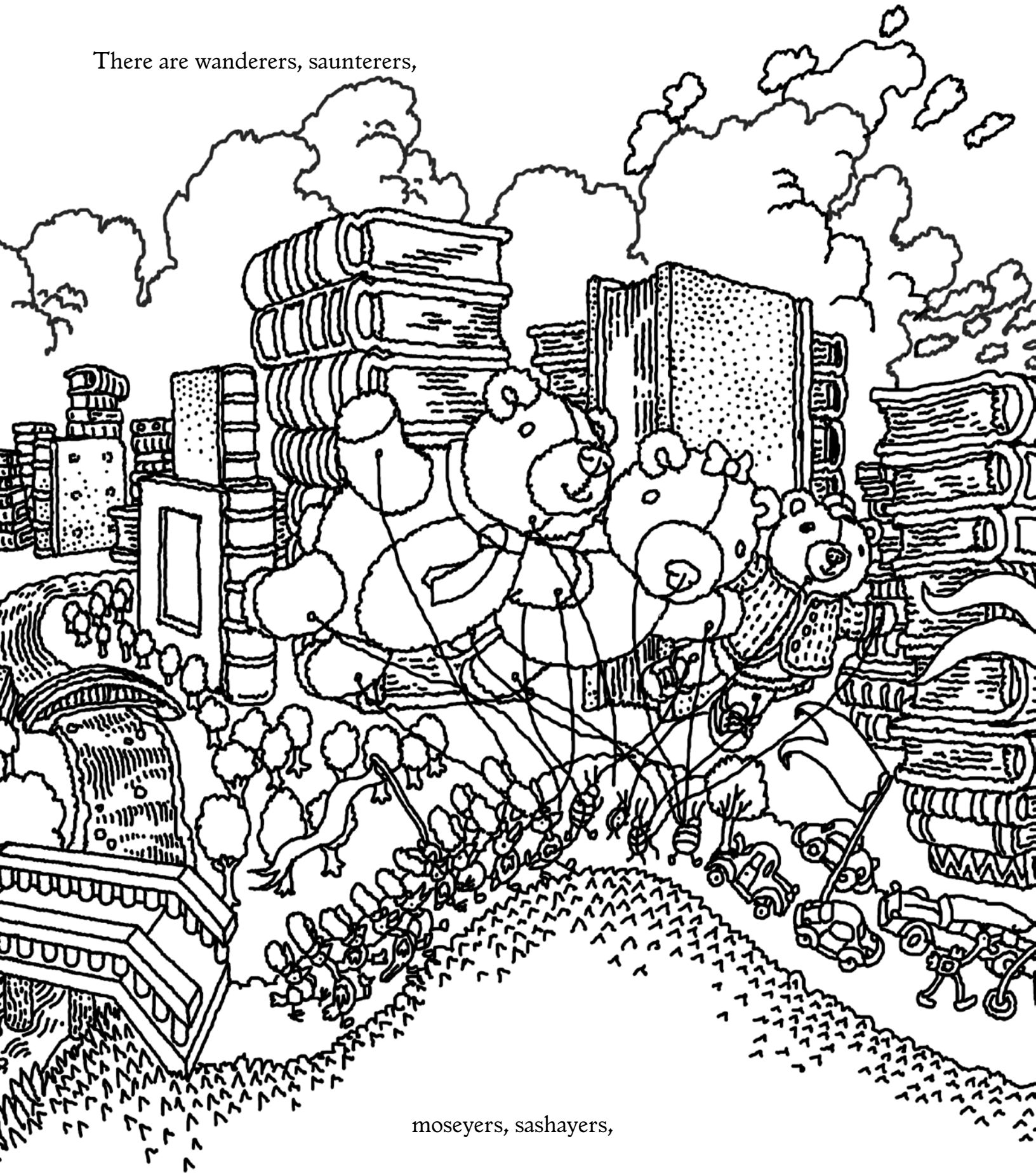
shufflers, and striders,



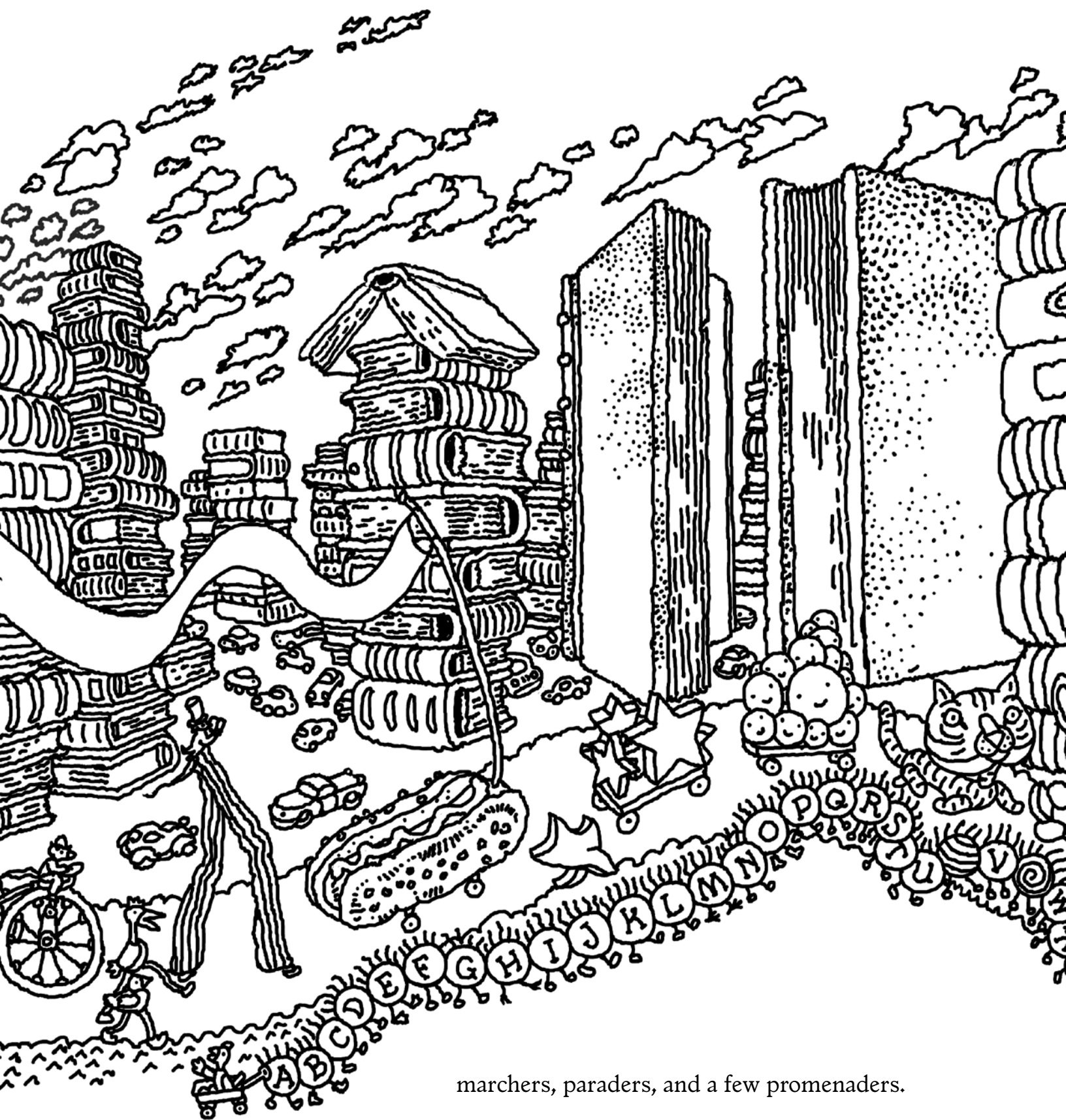


and hilltop-hikers.

moseyers, sashayers,

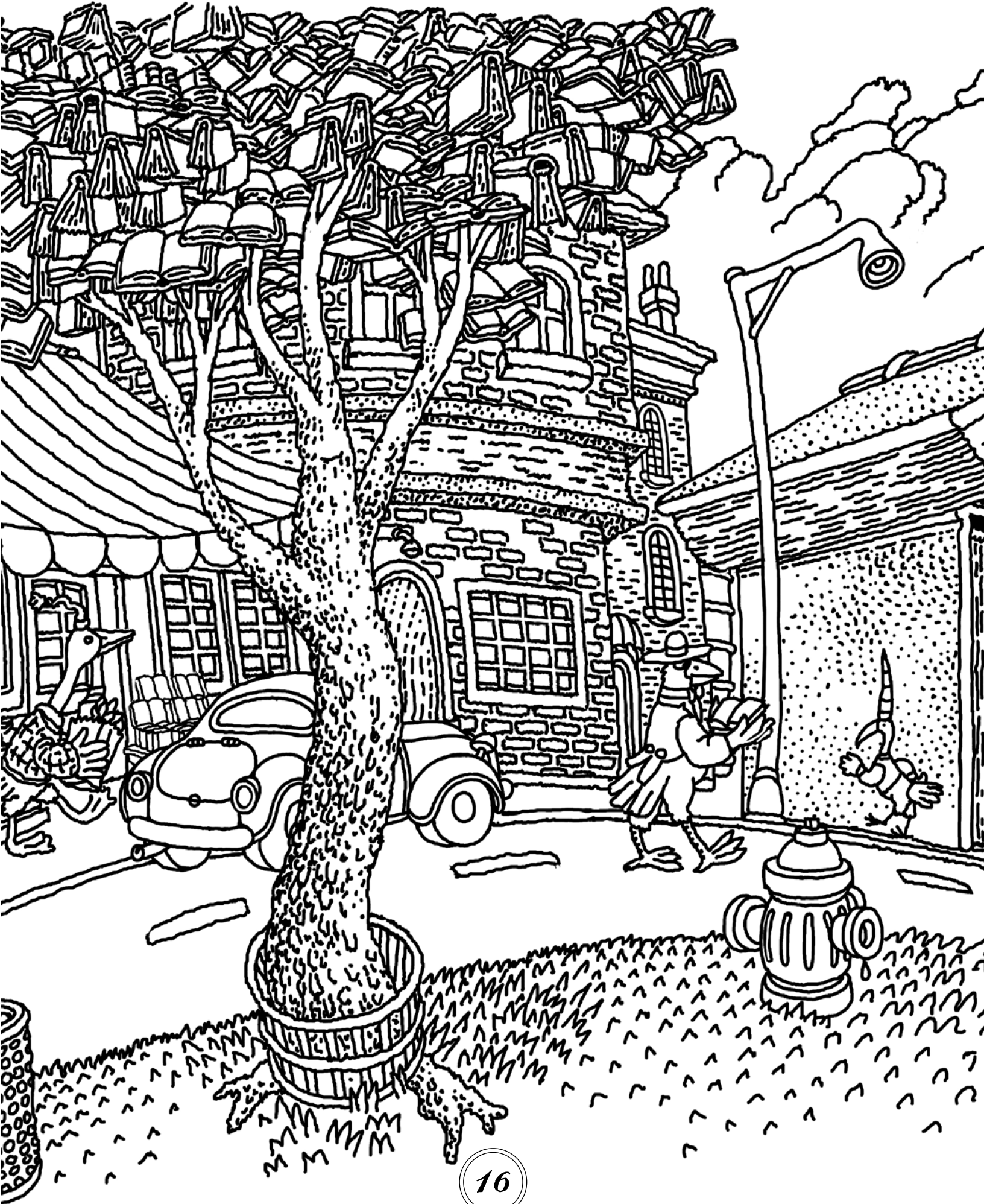


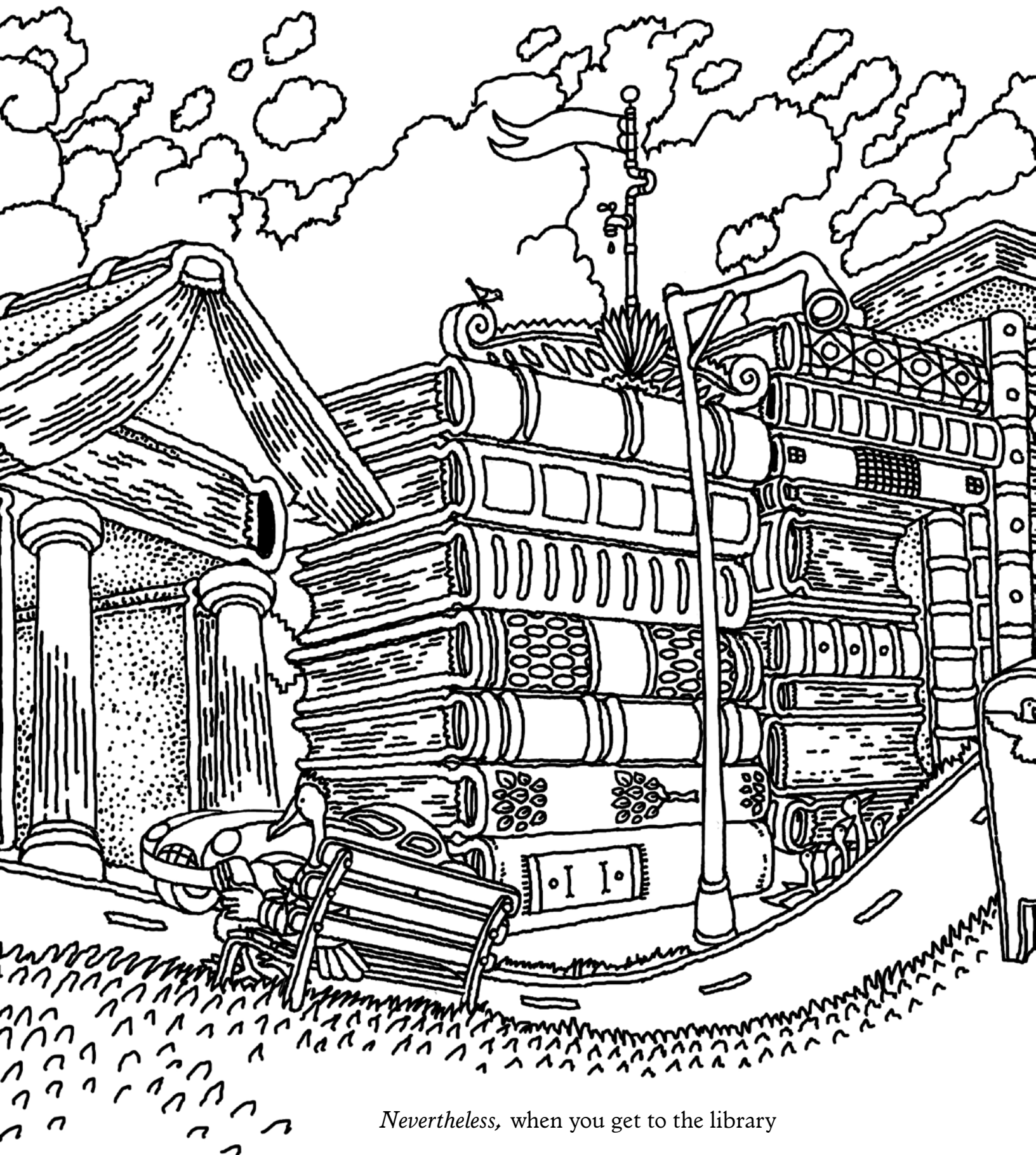
marchers, paraders, and a few promenaders.

let's not forget

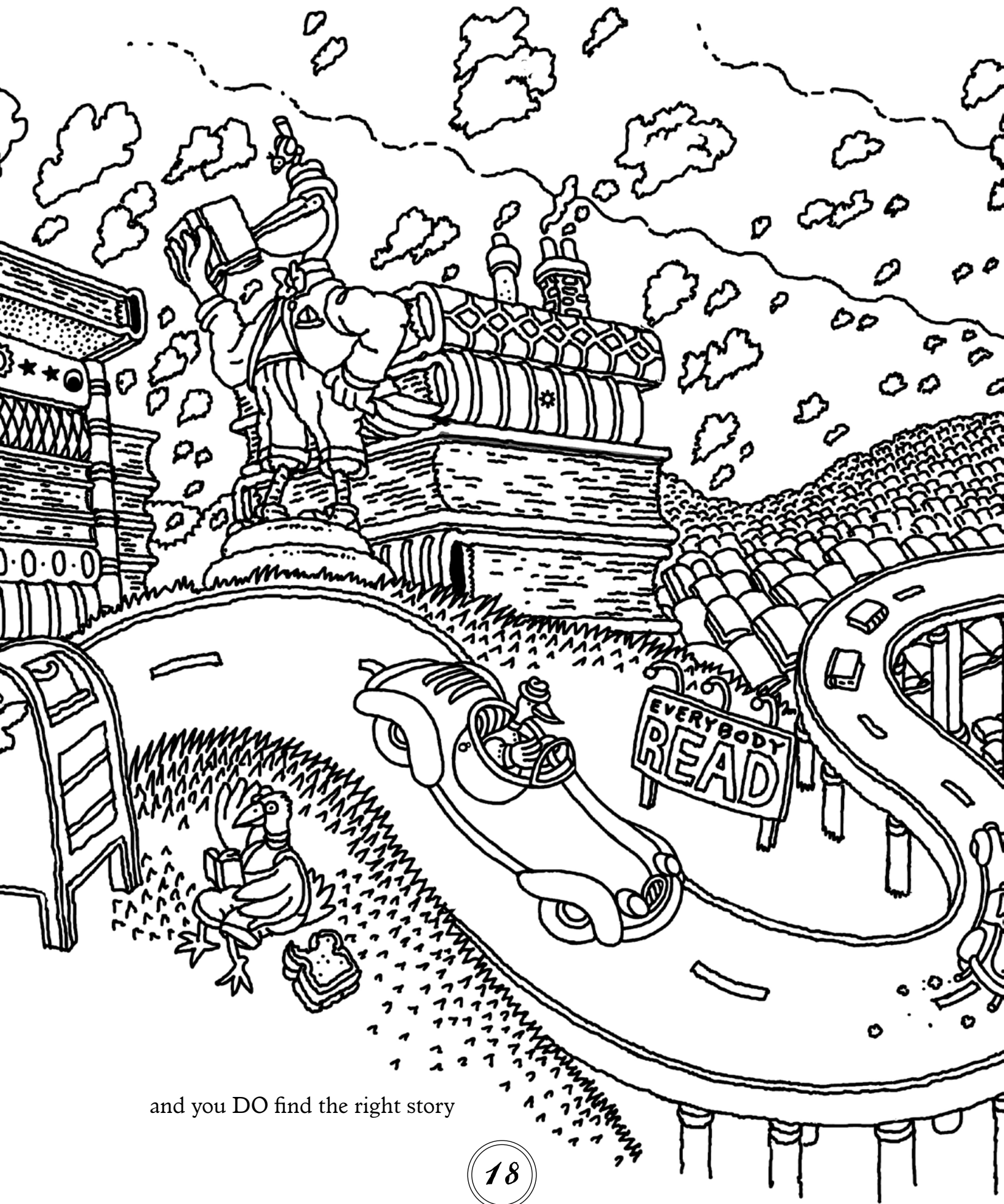

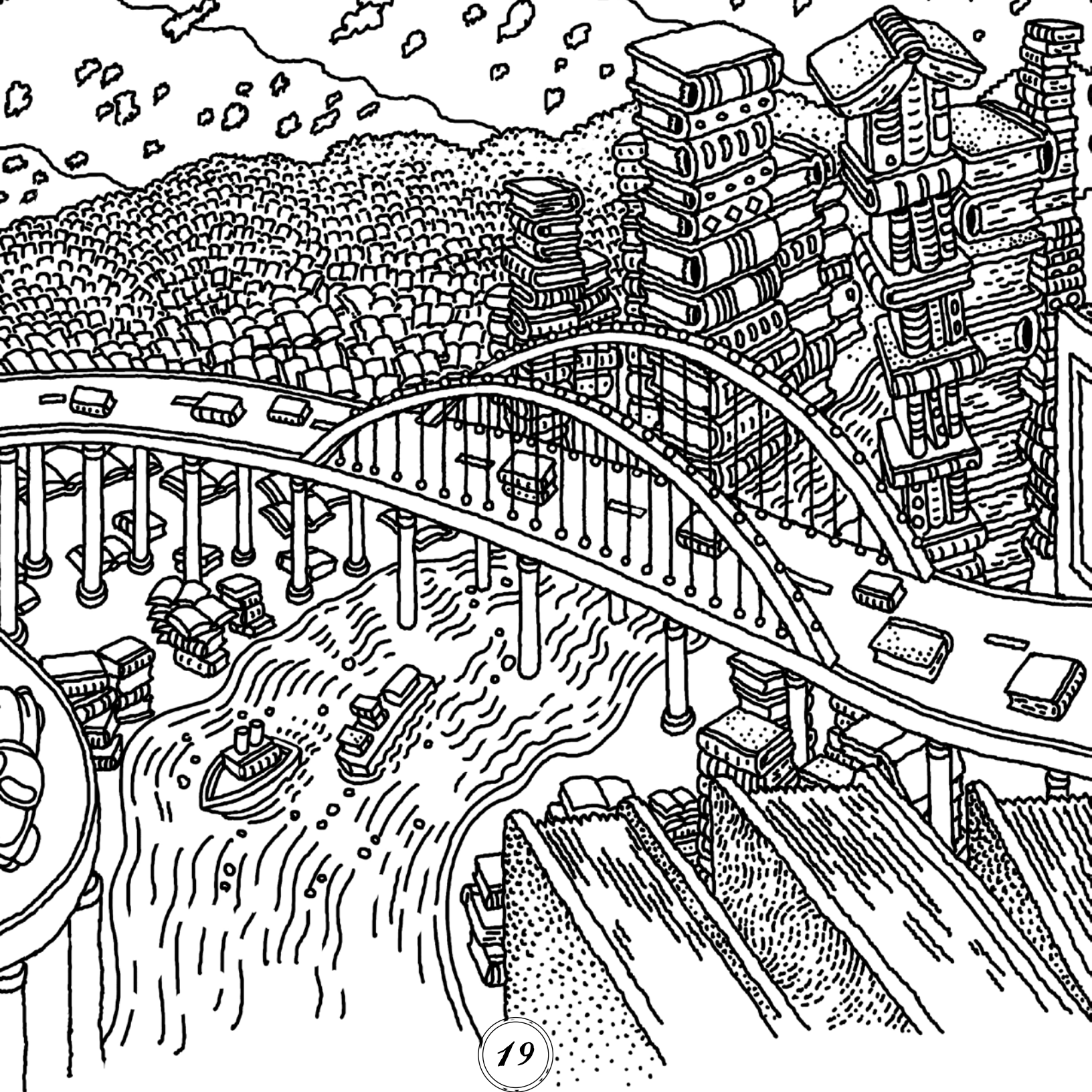


Nevertheless, when you get to the library

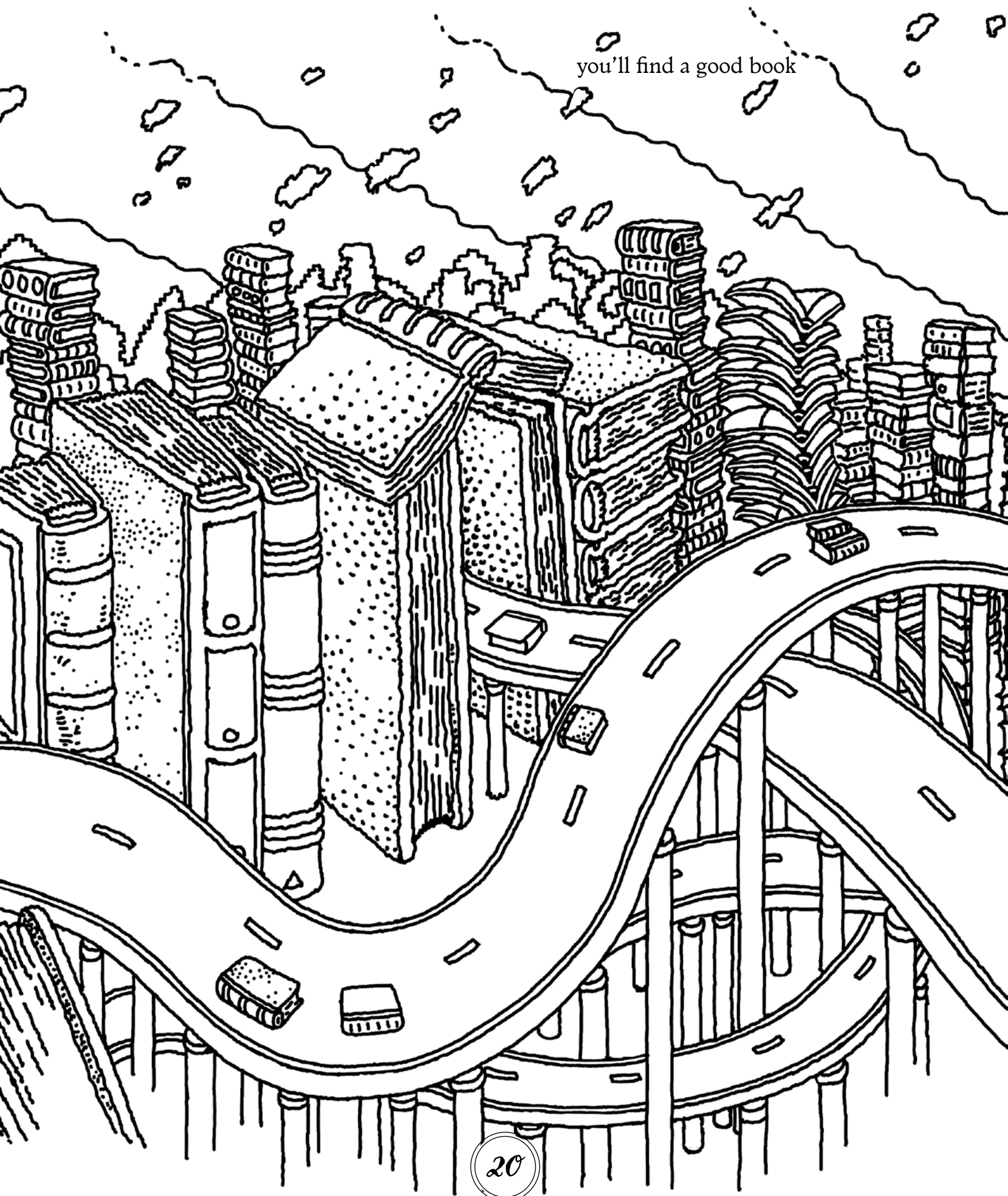


and you DO find the right story
