In the ensuing decade, the result of those confused beliefs would include the government raid on the Branch Davidian religious compound, which killed seventy-five people; the retaliatory Oklahoma City bombing, which killed 168; the beating of Black motorist Rodney King by four white LAPD officers and the insurrection that gutted South Central LA and cost sixty-four lives when they were acquitted; the stationhouse sexual assault and beating of Haitian Abner Louima by New York City policemen; the antiabortion zealots whose tactics escalated from protests to threats to murders and bombings; the Columbine school shooting in Colorado, which left fifteen people dead, including the two teenage gunmen; the killings of Brandon Teena in Nebraska, Matthew Shepard in Wyoming, and the thousands of other LGBTQ people beaten, raped, and killed whose stories were not considered news. 



In 1995, according to UN data, women accounted for two-thirds of the world's illiterate, up to 90 percent of the world's 1.3 billion poor, more than 90 percent of all refugees and displaced people, the most cases of sexually transmitted diseases and AIDS, and the majority of the world's elderly, underemployed, and unemployed. They were also the civilians most likely to be murdered or maimed in war, a statistic that had become horrifyingly clear in daily headlines from Rwanda and Bosnia. Three hundred and fifty thousand women and girls were murdered and raped in Rwanda in a period of just one hundred days in 1994, and up to 70 percent of those who survived were left HIV-positive. In Bosnia, soldiers raped tens of thousands of mostly Muslim women and girls over a three-year period ending in 1995 as part of an ethnic cleansing campaign and because women were considered spoils of war.




