Book 6: A Brave Beginning

Questions for thoughtful discussion

- 1) At the beginning of the book, Mona thinks: “Why did no one ever tell you that the scariest things weren’t just wolves and owls, but daring to take on new adventures?” What scary adventure is Mona taking on? Why do you think it is scary to her?
- 2) There are lots of fun rooms in the Heartwood Maple. What is your favorite? Why?
- 3) There are always a lot of new characters in a Heartwood Hotel book. In this book who is your favorite character? Why?
- 4) Mona is finally having memories of her parents. What are some of these memories? Why is she having them now? What does she learn about her parents?
- 5) Who is Frost Feather? (Hint: There could be more than one answer to this question!)
- 6) Tilly says it’s scary being brave, and Mona replies that she thinks that IS being brave: doing something even when it scares you. Do you agree? Can you describe a brave thing you or someone you know has done?
- 7) What does Mona learn about success? What do you think true success is?

ACTIVITY

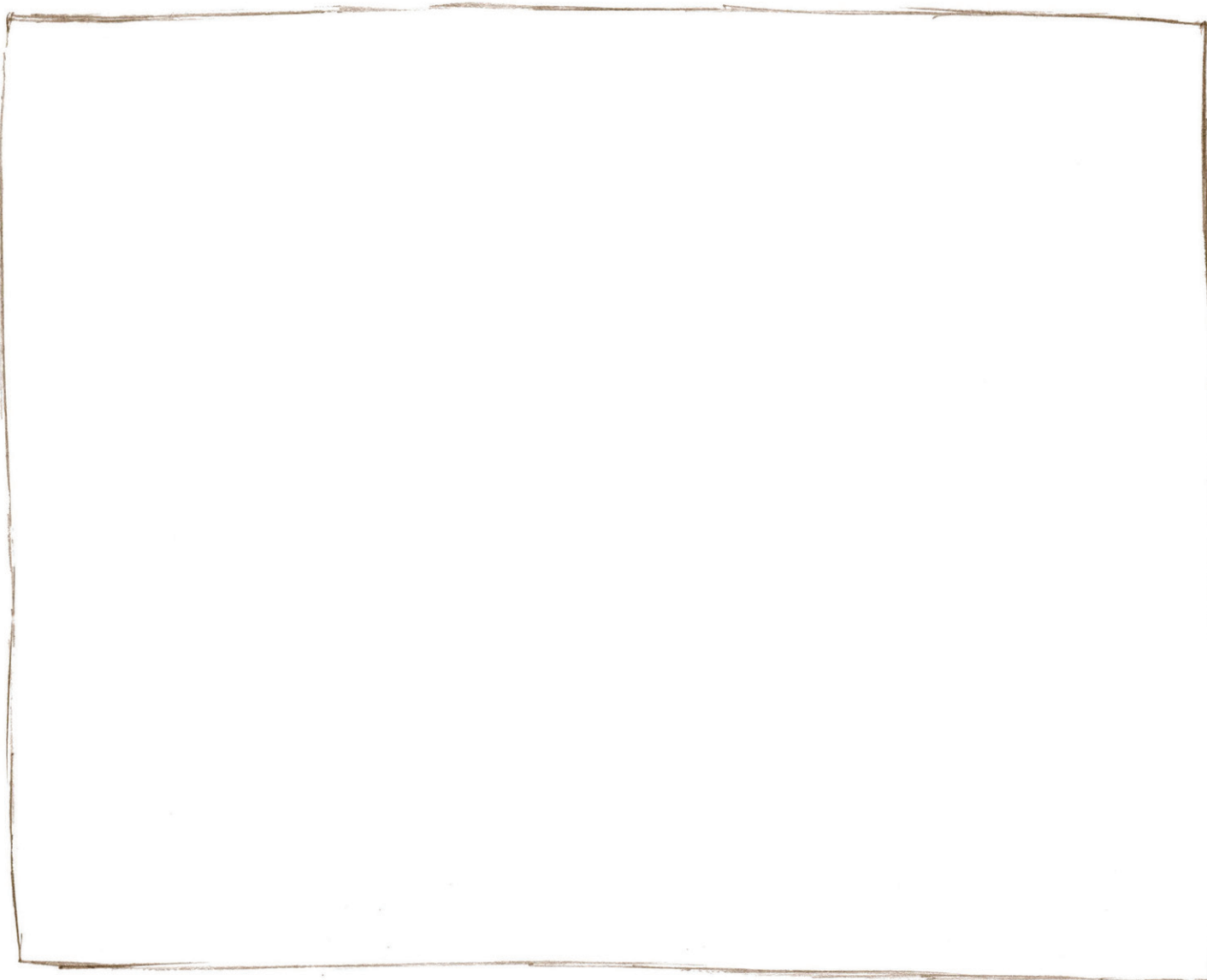
Draw your memory

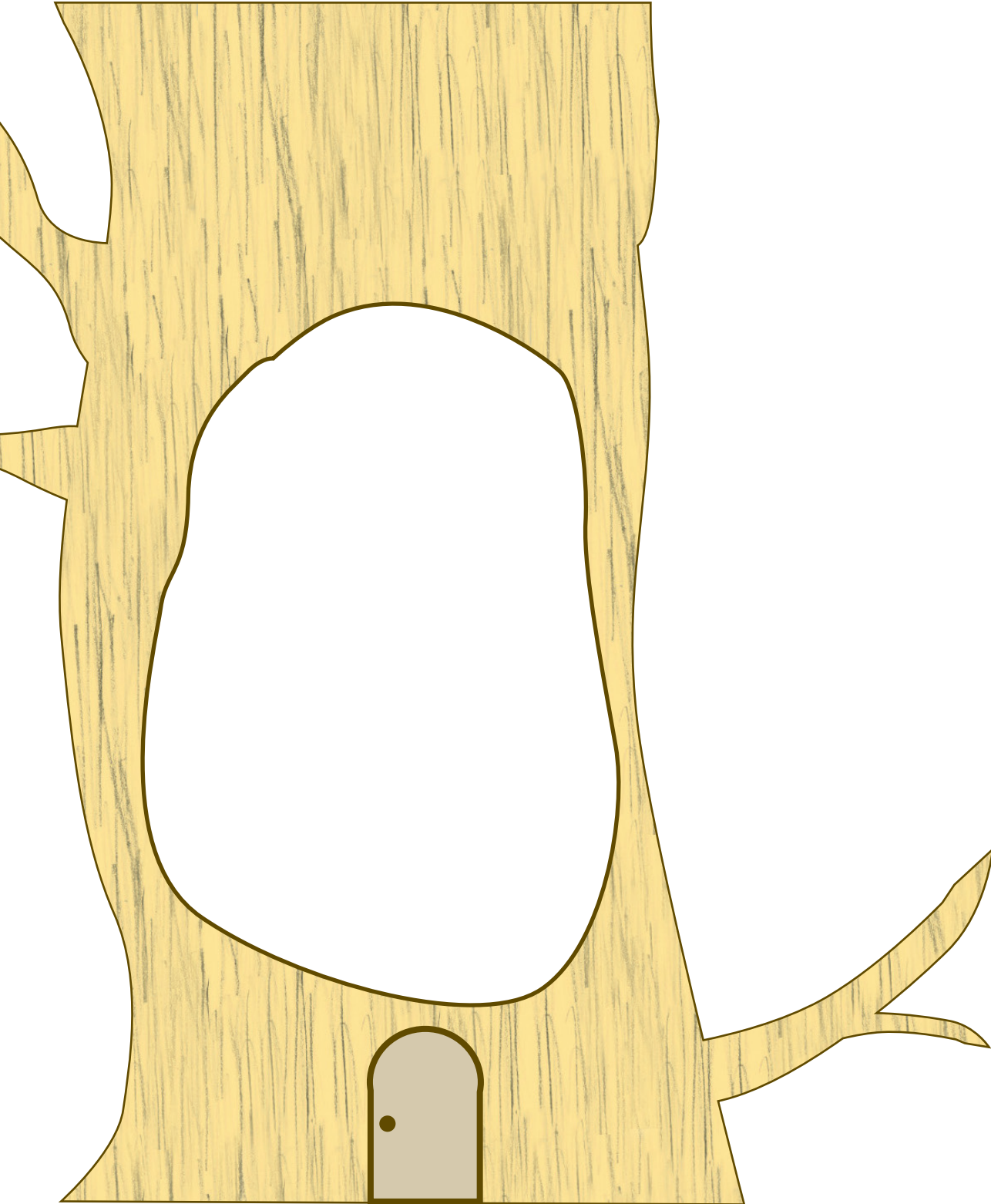

Design a playroom

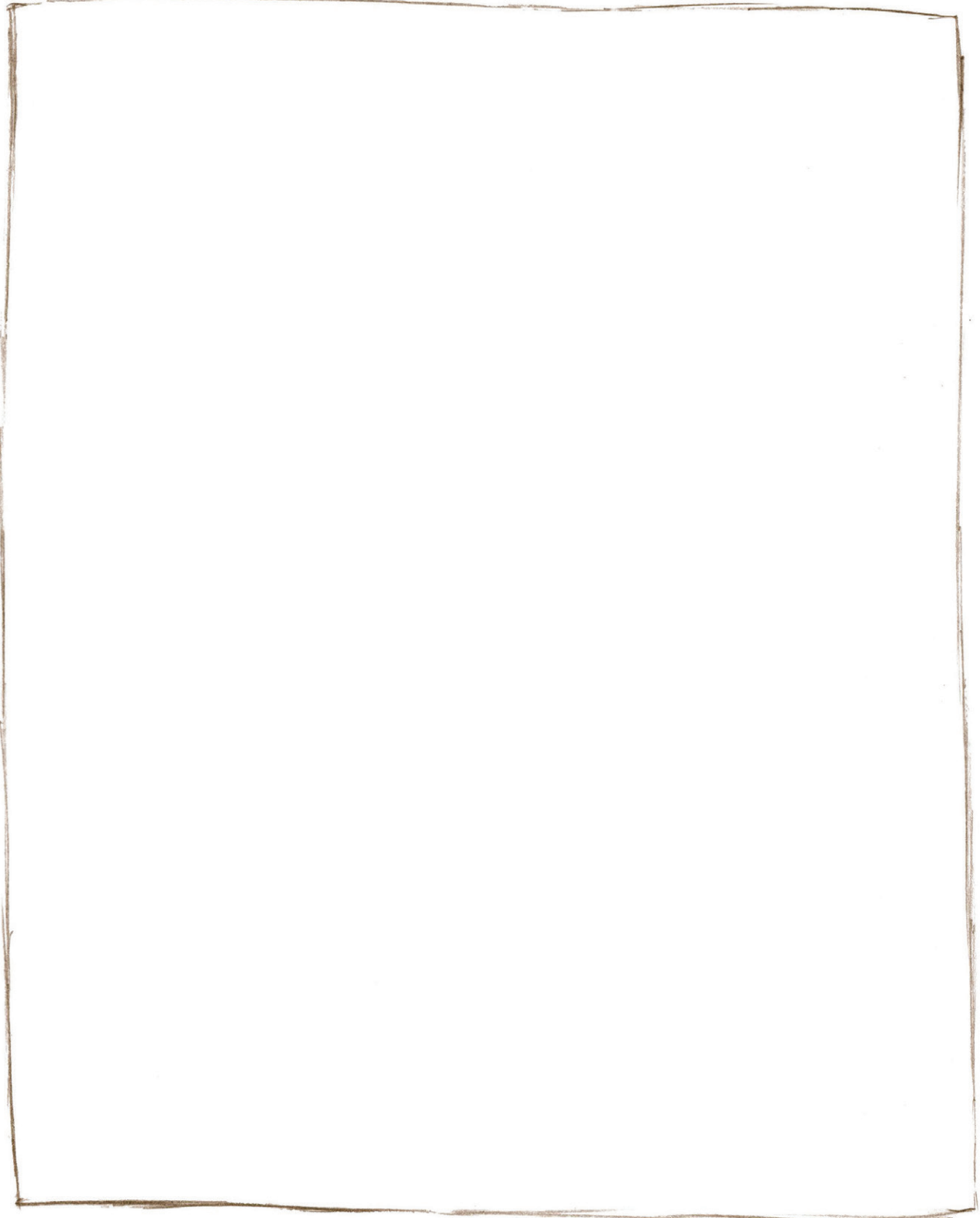
In the space below, design a new playroom for the Heartwood Hotel. This is like a playground for small animals. It could be inside or outside the tree. What fun things would you include?
